age pregnancy awareness month, is a solemn reminder of the pressing issue that plagues our society.

Dialogue sessions covered the following topics;

The group leaders took turns and reported back about their discussions. Youth friendly services and free access to healthcare services also contributes significantly to promotion of preventive measures such as contraception education, access to family planning services and availability of contraceptive methods.

Smoking harms nearly every organ of the body

Smoking harms nearly every organ of the body

- Tobacco in all its forms including snuff, hubbly bubbly and electronic cigarettes is harmful to health.
- Tobacco kills 25 700 South Africans each year as a result of direct use and nonsmokers being exposed to second-hand smoke,
- Cigarette smoking harms nearly every organ of the body, causes many diseases and non-smokers and reduces health of smokers.
- Tobacco is a major cause of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) like cancer, lung disease, diabetes and heart disease.
- Tobacco delays recovery from Covid-19
- Smoking weakens the body immune system, thus increasing the chances of smokers to contract TB and it lowers the response to TB treatment.
- HIV positive smokers have a greater risk of lung cancer than other smokers.
- Smoking reduces the effectiveness of anti HIV treatment drugs (ARVs)
- Second-hand smoke causes many diseases including stroke, lung cancers and coronary heart diseases in adults.

Electronic cigarettes

- Electronic cigarettes are harmful to health and have been linked to severe health conditions, including cancers, lung and heart diseases, chest pains, asthma, and high risk of stroke.
- The risk of respiratory problems caused by e-cigarette and tobacco use are linked worsening COVID-19 outcomes including death.
- Children and adolescents who start using Electronic cigarettes are more likely to progress to smoking tobacco products.
- Nicotine exposure during adolescence can harm brain development, including the parts of the brain that control attention, learning, mood and impulse control.














