


Debriefing was later held at Eshowe Hospital main boardroom whereby all findings were shared as well as Quality improvements were developed.

O ur Eye Clinic Optometry Team is patiently waiting to serve you during this year retina week and beyond.

RETINA is a layer of photoreceptors cells and glial cells within the eye that captures incoming photons and transmits them along neuronal pathways as both electrical and chemical signals for the brain to perceive a visual picture.

Retina week is a campaign which focuses on raising awareness about importance of Eye health specifically around Early detection, Prevention and Treatment of avoidable blindness.


Most common causes of retinal damage are related to old age and trauma .

We do advise those with Diabetes and Hypertension to come through as these are crucial and can lead to blindness.

Remember in SA 80% of all cases of blindness is avoidable either through prevention or through treatment. The Retina diseases are the following but not limited to:-

- 1. Glaucoma
- 2. Optic Atrophy
- 3. Hypertensive Retinopathy
- 4. Diabetic Retinopathy
- 5. Retinitis Pigmentosa

N ationally breastfeeding week is celebrated every year from the 1st to the 7th of August to highlight the importance of breastfeeding to the mother, the infant and the whole society with regards to child health and survival. The theme for this years' breastfeeding week was "Step up for breastfeeding – Educate and Support' and focused on strengthening the capacity of stakeholders to provide and sustain breastfeeding-friendly environments for families. A public health approach includes multi-sectoral collaborative actions to promote, protect and support breastfeeding throughout continuum of care.

Eshowe Hospital celebrated breastfeeding week through various events held within the hospital and surrounding clinics. Posters, pamphlets and information messages highlighting the theme, were distributed throughout the wards and departments.

The week was opened with a breastfeeding awareness march on the 1st of August 2022, where staff from MCHW walked through the hospital with posters, banners and balloons singing breastfeeding awareness songs. On the 2nd and 5th of August awareness talks were held in GOPD and Postnatal wards, with a question and answer session at the end, where moms received small prizes as a token for their participation.

The main event, a breastfeeding celebration, took place on the 3rd of August 2022 in the passage between antenatal and postnatal wards. This event was organised by the MBFI committee with the help of all MCHW staff. Pregnant women and new mothers from postnatal and antenatal in- and outpatient departments attended. Mrs LP Khumalo, our lay counsellor, directed the programme and kept

the audience engaged and entertained with songs. OM LL Khuba opened and welcomed everybody and OM LD Mgenge and OM NH Mkhize gave health education on the importance of breastfeeding and the risks of not breastfeeding. The programme was closed by a vote of thanks by OM T Miya, who also presented the mothers with gifts as token for their participation. A question and answer session at the end saw mothers who listened well, receive small gifts for their correct answers and participation.

Breastfeeding awareness events were also held throughout the month of August at the 6 clinics that fall under Eshowe Hospital. These were supported by the community service dietitian.

We thank everybody for their input and support, who made this post-pandemic breastfeeding celebration a real success.

Synch Implementation

showe Hospital has been identified to pilot the Synchronised National Communication in Health (SyNCH).

The Synchronised National Communication in Health (hereafter referred to as SyNCH) is the software that was developed to be an electronic prescribing platform for the public health sector of South Africa.

SyNCH was designed with the intention to standardize and digitize processes within the public health sector with the vision of achieving Universal Health Coverage through the National Health Insurance (NHI) fund.

Eshowe Hospital was selected as a pilot site for SyNCH hospital implementation. In




addition, SyNCH was implemented at Sinethemba Clinic to assess whether adjustments made to SyNCH could accompany multiple pharmacies and Pick Up Points within one hospital.


The systems scans client Identity document when the Doctor prescribes on the system and then When client report to the dispensing point produces Identity document for the Pharmacist to scan. Once identity scanned the system tells the pharmacist what medication was prescribed, that medication will also be scanned as being dispensed so that the system can be able to generate a useful report about the patient without any staff member having to fill paper work.

Al the relevant staff members were trained by HST accordingly.
