#### We belong

A sense of belonging makes people feel at home as members of the community or organization . The most important aspect of belonging is being part of an effective team, a team that works together for the people out there to serve

We belong also is about fostering partnerships with the recipients and beneficiaries of public services and thus ensuring that the public service is responsible to peoples needs in line with the notion of "putting people first"

#### We care

Public servants should be courteous when providing services to the public by listening to there problem, apologizing when necessary and serving people with a smile. We care because we are devoted to serve, to the end, ensuring that we deliver beyond cus-

tomer expectations. Public servants should respect all citizens irrespective of background, gender, colour or creed

### Hearing Loss In Focus

The month of September besides being dedicated to an array of other causes, is also Deaf Awareness Month. To focus attention on the Deaf, Eshowe Lions invited Browyn Heins to address them on the work being done in the area regarding deaf or hard of hearing people.

Uthungulu District has an estimated population of 899 000 people who are served by two regional hospitals, six

it is too late to remedy. Children between 7 and 10 years will have missed their development milestones to develop spoken language. This makes signing very important in such cases. Cued speech is another strategy, similar to signing, but uses eight symbols and signs which make up the cued speech language Bimodal communication includes both

district hospitals, , 44 fixed clinics and 14 mobile clinics. Each of the eight hospitals have a waiting list of 60 to 100 patients needing audiology attentions. There are two audiologists available in the Uthungulu District. Ms Heins works with a number of communication strategies. The first is the auditory oral approach , which includes a child being fitted with amplification in the form of a hearing aid and learn-

signing and oral speech

Eshowe currently has 100 patients requiring hearing aids.

Second-hand hearing aids are in most cases usable. Anyone with old hearing aids is encouraged to donate them to the Eshowe Lions who will pass them on. Ms Heins plans to visit local schools and the Zululand

ing normal spoken language

Speech therapy and aural habilitation are extremely important for success

In rural areas, however there is no early detection of hearing loss and by the time a problem is detected,
