Some of the key Messages for 2023 breastfeeding week were :Making breastfeeding at work, work, makes societies work! Breastfeeding provides vital health and nutritional benefits for children with positive lifelong impacts, building healthier populations – and workforces - for the future. Women shouldn't have to choose between breastfeeding their children and their jobs. Breastfeeding support is possible regardless of workplace, sector, or contract type. Effective maternity protections improve children's and women's health and increase breastfeeding. And yet, at present, more than half a billion working women lack access to vital maternity provisions; many more find themselves unsupported when they go back to work.

General Justice Gizenga Mpanza Regional Hospital Dietetic, Paediatric, nursery and maternity had some activities to promote breastfeeding in the workplace under the theme "Enabling breastfeeding for working parents". There were daily activities which included Posters and banner display, Visiting malls to issue pamphlets to employers and employees on breastfeeding in the work place, Breastfeeding competition.

The main event was held on 8 August 2023. During this event new Mothers were invited both staff and patients. It was emphasised that breastfeeding time is important and staff must be given their time to breastfeed.
