he week of 23rd to 27th October 2023 was designed to commemorate international OT week, Mental Health Month, Stroke Day and Global OT Day.

This years' theme was "Unity in Community". Emphasis was on promoting our role in working together with others to facilitate better participation and community interaction

different paediatric conditions that are typically seen by occupational therapy. This included education on the different diagnosis, developmental milestones with newborn mothers.

The monthly Autism parent support group which is a collaboration with Speech therapy department was also a success. Handouts and home programs were incorporated to the events of this day, staff members and patients came through in numbers to get information.

Mental Health: Focus being on Mental Health Awareness; mental health problems include, but are not limited to, depression, anxiety, substance abuse and job stress are common, affecting individuals, their families and co-workers, and the broader community. In addition, they have a direct impact on workplaces through increased absenteeism, reduced productivity, and increased costs. Very few South Africans seek treatment for their mental disorders. OT team conducted a structured therapeutic sessions for staff using



the Jacobsen's Relaxation technique/Progressive muscle relaxation. OT in mental health education done and a take home booklet of relaxation activities.

This program sought to offer some experience of techniques that each person could implement in their daily routine to improve the quality of their mental health. Refreshments were provided for participants. The sessions were well attended and feedback on its impact from staff has been positive.

OT Escapade: We hosted a 'FUN DAY' for all staff to participate in and lots of prizes and giveaways for completed ADL (activities of daily living) challenges. Highlighting what OT does.

This program displayed how broad a scope OT is, how their holistic treatment can take multiple forms, including:

- ⇒ Collaborating on interventions to address physical, cognitive and mental health problems.
- ⇒ Teaching alternative ways of doing things-through the use of assistive devices.

 $\Rightarrow$  Modifying the environment to make it more accessible.

⇒ Consulting with the family for education/training to decrease caregiver burden.

 $\Rightarrow$  Providing knowledge on ways to influence your own wellbeing.

Wheelchair training: Occupational therapists are also known for issuing wheelchairs in the hospital. The wheelchair race/obstacle course offered orientation to wheelchair use and safety

precautions clients have to adhere to.

The team also provided stroke guidelines and demonstration in activities that stroke clients may have difficulty engaging in such as eating and dressing. Participants got to practice one-handed techniques that enable stroke surviving clients to be independent in their daily lives.

Hand Hygiene: Sr.Mahlaba (IPC Rep) conducted hand hygiene education and illustrated the proper hand washing techniques.

Occupational Therapy Department at King Edward VIII comprises of 5 OT's, each with a passion and drive for the profession different to the rest! They thrive on service delivery and enjoy working within an MDT approach and try their best not to pull at strings not within their reach. Their treatments are 100% dedicated to the patients. 


#### ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL VISIT BY THE ROBINHOOD FOUNDATION
