We appreciate the great support we had from our seniors from Head Office, District Office and sister Districts during those trying times.

Currently MGMH is undergoing a decommissioning process where it will become a fully -fledged District Hospital. This is due to the new Regional Hospital, Dr. Pixley Ka Isaka Seme Memorial hospital in KwaMashu Township. This is coming with a lot of changes in the hospital that will affect all the patients who are coming to

hospital for different ailments and conditions. The following services will be moved to DPKISMH in strategic phases due to their specialization. i.e. Internal Medicine, Regional (Ortho and Surgery), Regional (Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology) make the transition as seamless as possible. MGMH will now offer services of District level, Patients needing expert level of care would be sent to DPKISMH.

Further community engagement will be done using the following platforms: War Rooms, Oeration Sukuma Sakhe ,Izimbizo and Medica Houses.

Lastly I would like to warmly welcome the new Senior Management Team Member Assistant Director Human Resources: Mr. SP Mkhize, he has been working at MGMH as Senior HR Officer and was appointed as AD:HR with effect from the 1st September 2022.










#### **NURSES DAY**

It was a joyous and a memorable day to Men of MGMH when they celebrated Men's Day on the 29 July 2022. Mr LS Maphumulo: CEO welcomed everybody and thanked them for making time and came in numbers to gain knowledge, share their experiences and challenges they face as men. Doctor Gama addressed an elephant in the room when he spoke of prostate cancer which according to Statistics 1 man in 8 will be diagnosed with prostate cancer and a second leading cause of death amongst South African Men. Dr. reminded men on the importance of regular health checks as it can assist in early detection and management of diseases.

Advocate Mngadi, guest speaker gave insight to men on 3 different challenges they usually face i.e Domestic Violence, Maintenance and Sexual Harassment (allegations and rape). He cited few of the contributing factors to domestic violence

which were financial challenge, family expectations and society. With this being said, men were reminded that for every action taken there are consequences and men should know that laws are not tailored to oppress men but men must abide by the laws.

He talked about child support which in most cases men find themselves victimized by the process as they believe they are solely responsible for child support. Men were delighted to learn that mothers also have full responsibility towards the child just like the father and further information can be acquired from court. Advocate spoke of sexual harassment at work and the last discussion was on different non— verbal communication and gestures that could be translated as sexual assault, therefore men should look out for these and make sure they stay at the better side of the law.

### **AFRICA VACCINATION WEEK**

World Immunization week was celebrated from the 24-30 April 2022 internationally, with the aim to raise awareness of the value of vaccines and immunization.

Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Hospital POPD together with COVID-19 Vaccination teams took it upon themselves to ensure that clients were receiving factual information on the importance immunization, its benefits and the mishaps of getting immunized from birth till elderly stage. Immunization prepares the body to fight serious infections, preventing outbreaks and serves as protection for everyone that has been immunized. Immunization is vital as it prevents diseases like Polio Pertussis (whooping cough), Dipherna, Measles, COVID-19, Meningitis, Mumps, Rotavirus, Homophiles, influenza Type B and Hepatitis.

Omission of immunization can lead to transmission of preventable diseases, may infect people that are not immunized of any age. And may possibly lead to even complications and diseases.

It is thus vital to get immunized from newborns, infants, toddlers, teenagers and older people. The roving Covid-19 Vaccinators also went to different wards and departments encouraging patients and staff to get vaccinated emphasizing the benefits it has on the immune system.

would like to thank the staff and doctors from casualty and the nurses and doctors from ward 10 for the good dire given to me during my stay for a heart attack. I was brot in on the morning of the 27th April from the unit 10 clinic labelled a stemi patient. Spent the day at casualty and was taken to ward the next morning as soon as beds became available. I was put in high risk patients care for the next two nights then moved to the next ward. The evening of the 29th I suffered a mild attack of which Dr picked up by by the ecg requested because of my complaints with pain. I had 2 done the next day at 2 different time's, second being worst than the first. The Dr attending to me stayed till this was done and kept me in loop of all that was happening. He was not happy and wanted immediate transfer. .1and 2nd May being a public holiday didn't make it any easier. However his persistence with calls and emails sent to Dr across came to light for me to be taken in on the 2nd to Albert. My andiogram was done on the 3rd with there being a balloon blast and stent. I was discharged on the 5th April.

Likewise with Albert luthuli, Dr Nadar had taken me into theatre. And the night /day nurse took extremely good care of me.

I would like to mention specifically Dr L Bala who made me feel comfortable in knowing I was in good care made me be at ease. His passion and drive for being a Dr is what's needed so badly nowadays. This was a free service offered to me and at no given time was I made to feel this way.

I am forever grateful.
