Nkandla Hospital Measles Campaign

The primary objective of conducting mass immunization campaign was to eliminate measles by giving vaccines to as many children over a short period of time in a large geographic area. Nkandla hospital engaged in the measles campaign which ran from 12 to 30 June.

Children from 6 months to 4yrs & 11 months were vaccinated irrespective of their immunization status. Nurses visited the surrounding crèches situated far from health care facilities, this move even assisted in catching up for those children that are not brought for vaccination as well.

The commitment and the hard work of the staff contributed tremendously to the success of this campaign.

Circumcision Campaign



Medical male circumcision is one of the most common procedures performed worldwide and complications are very rare and usually easily resolved. Nkandla Hospital is among those that encourage males to get circumcised. On the 1st of July 2017, another MMC campaign was conducted at the Hospital for males aged 10–49yrs, this was the perfect opportunity for youngsters as they had a short break from school. It was pleasing to see a lot of youngsters taking the initiative and committing themselves in being circumcised. MMC has been proved to reduce the risk of HIV-negative men becoming infected with HIV.
