Vision

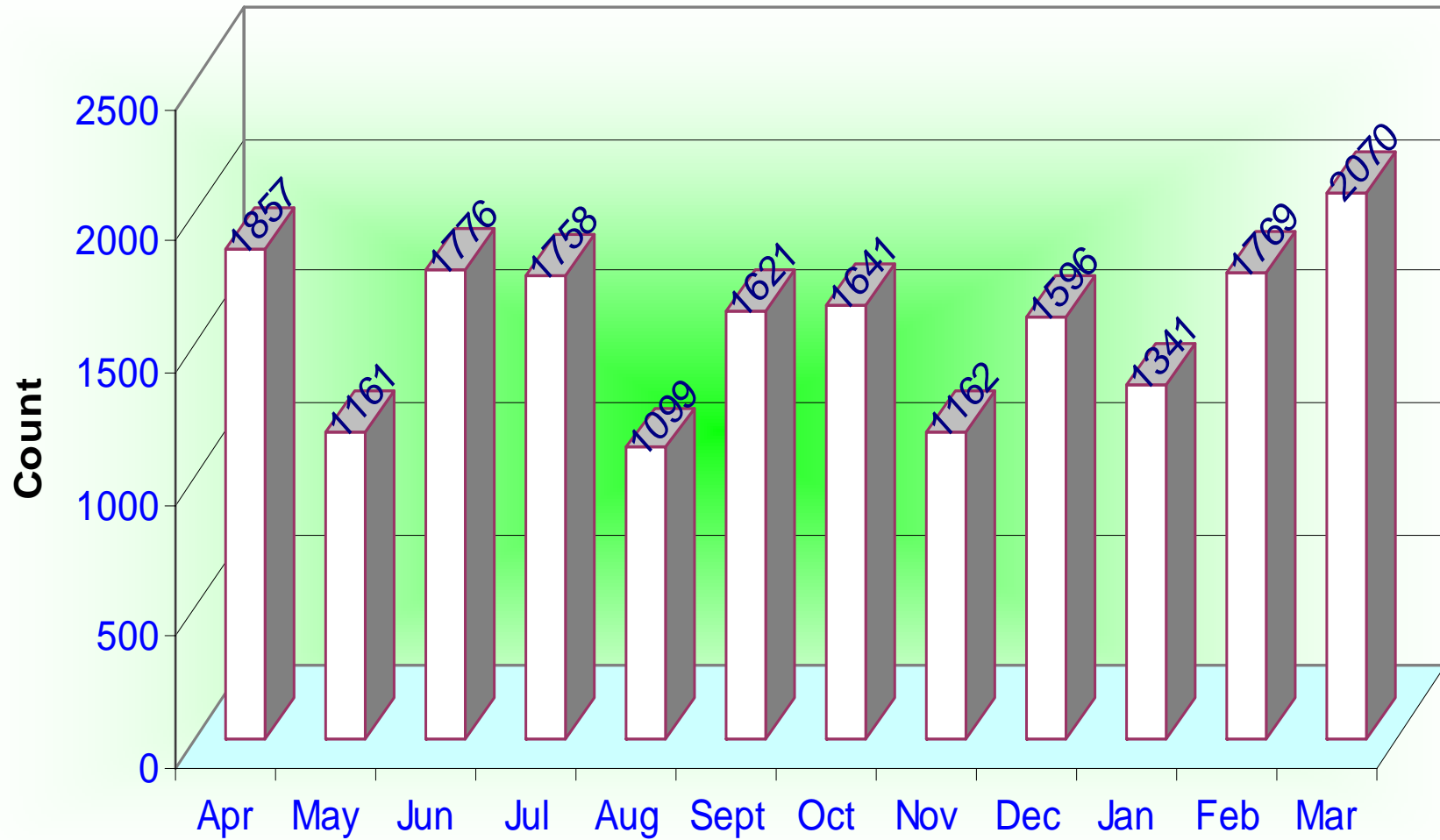

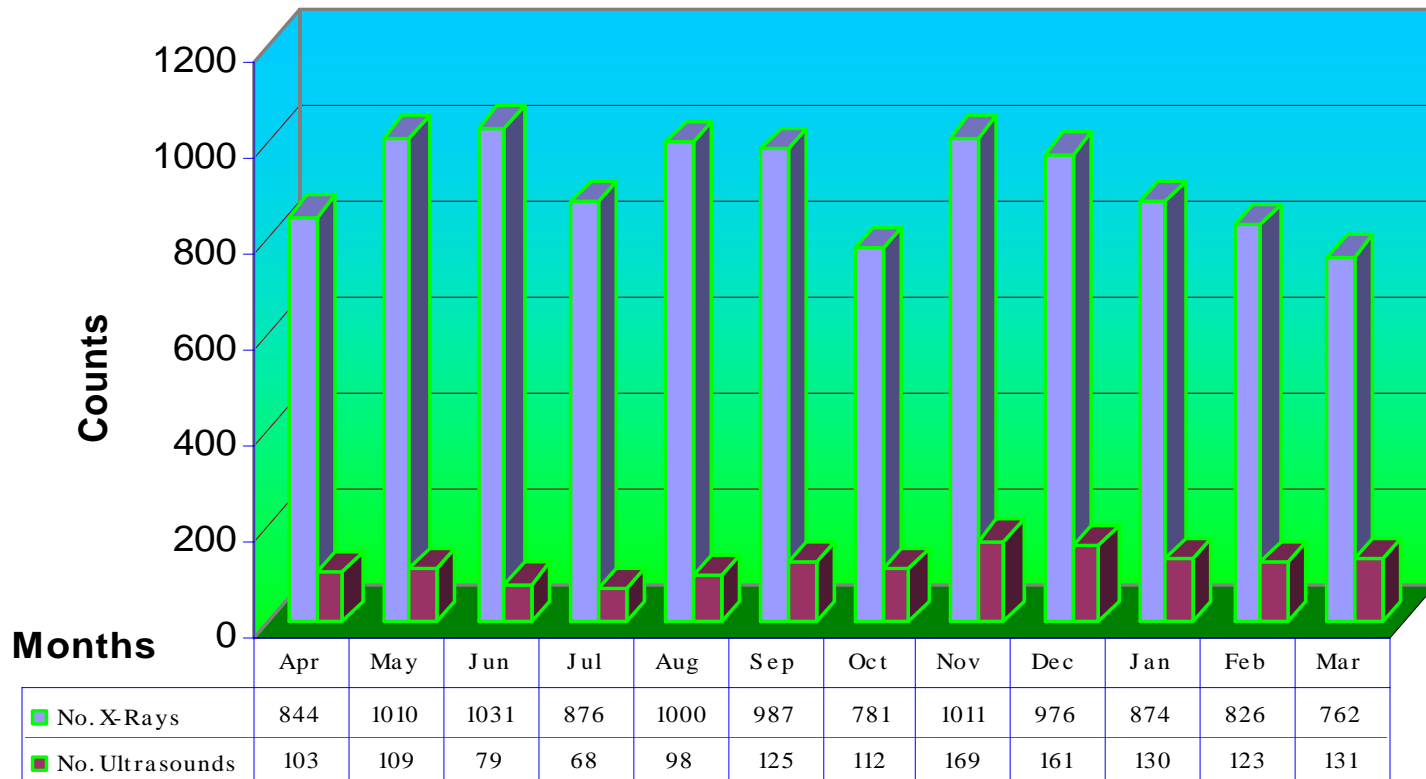

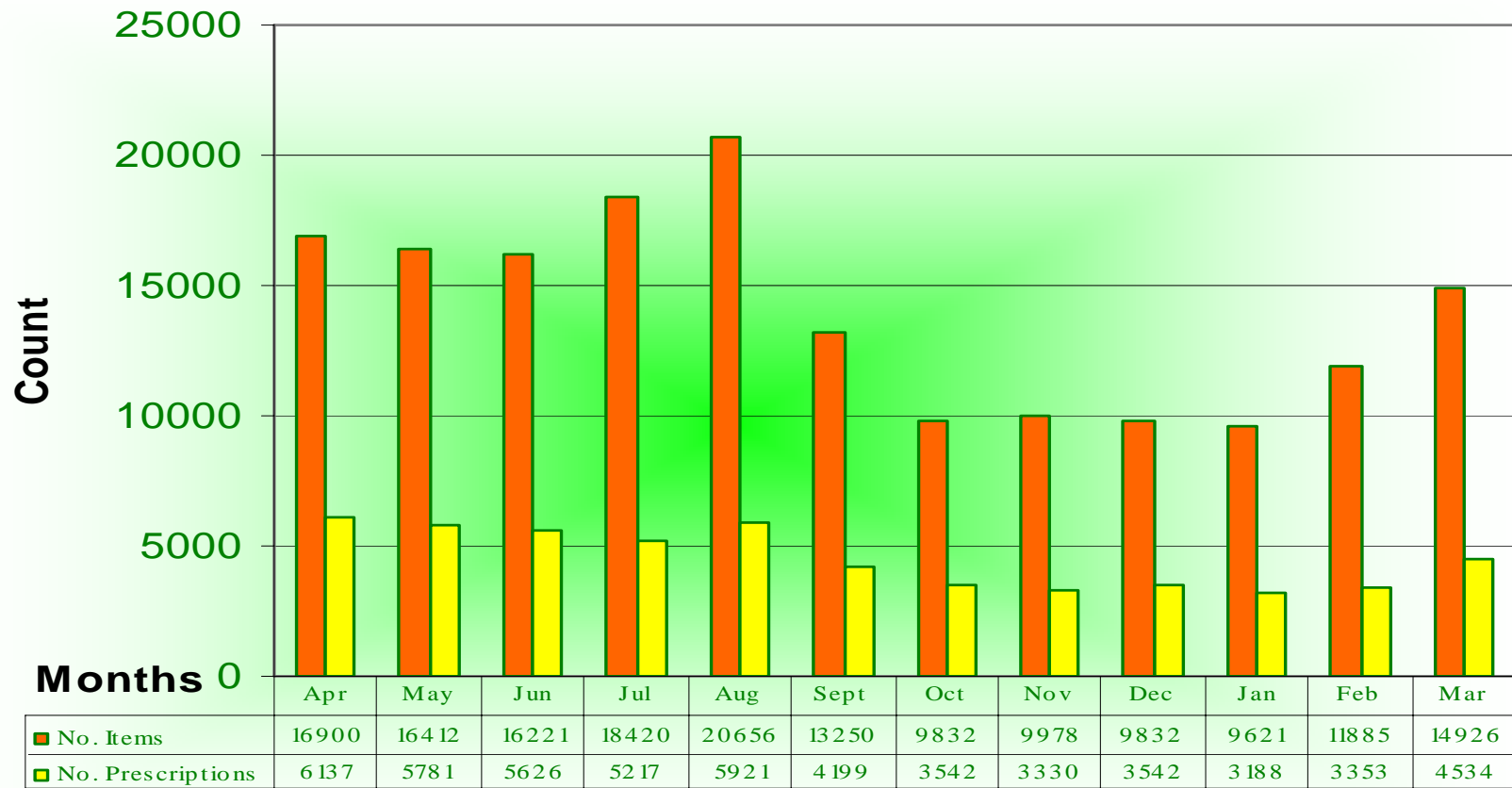
TOTAL OPD HEADCOUNT



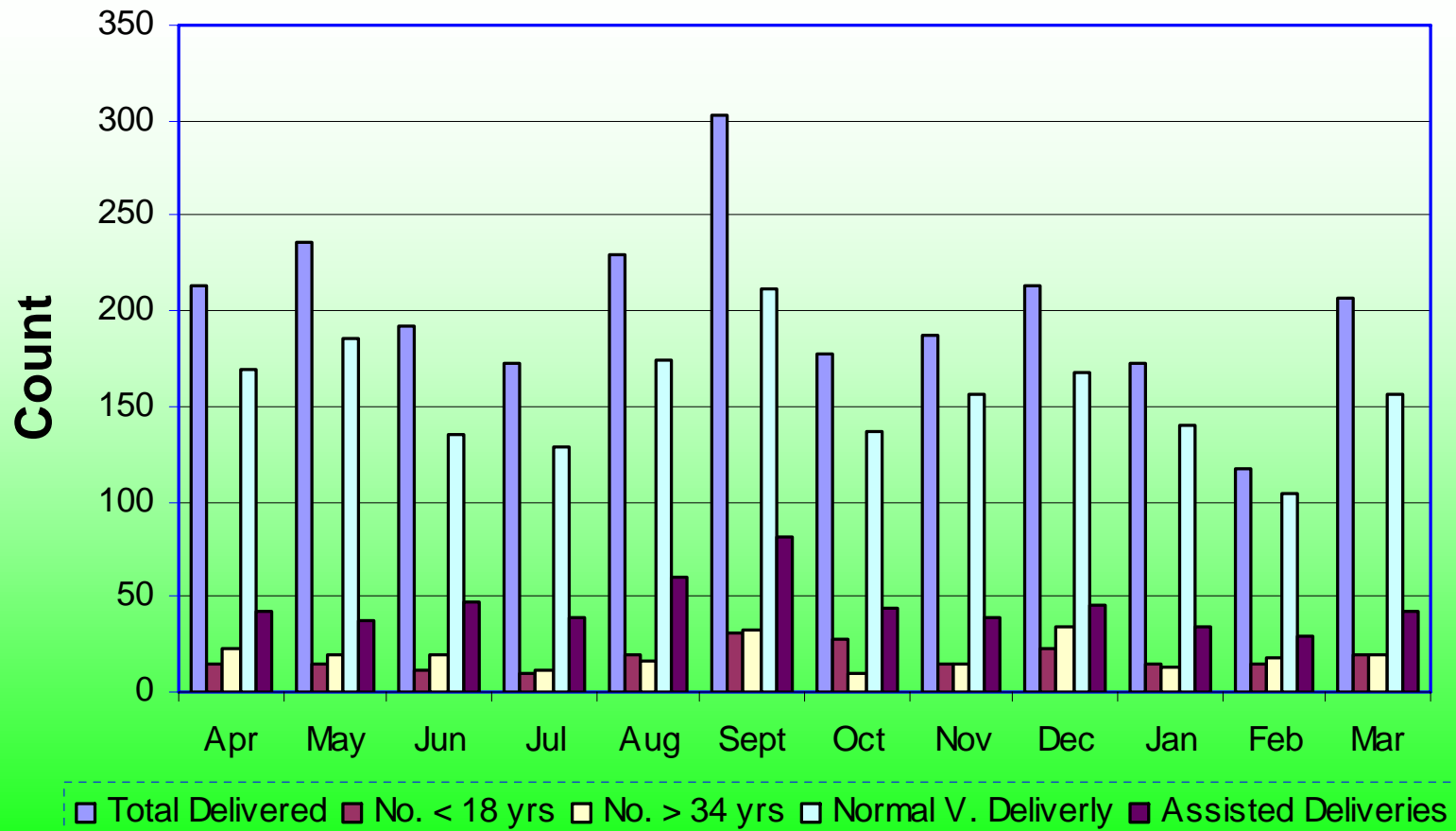

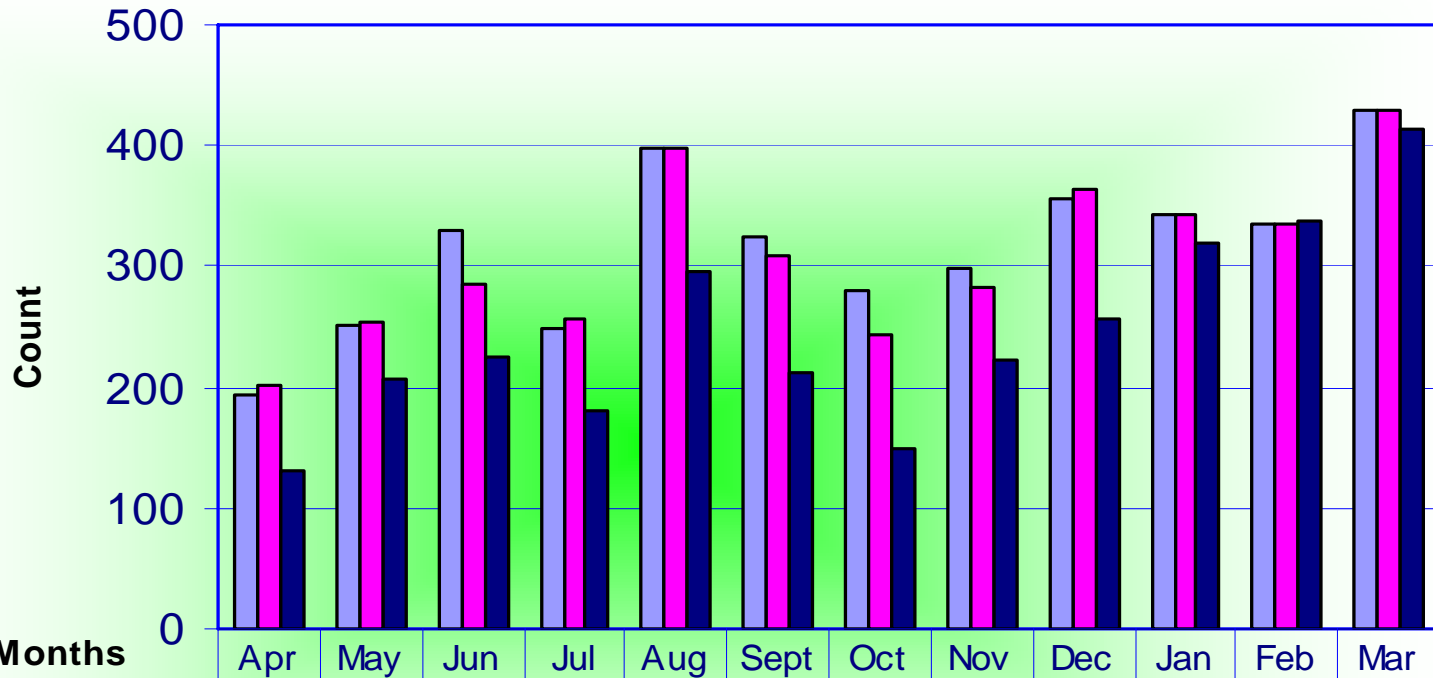

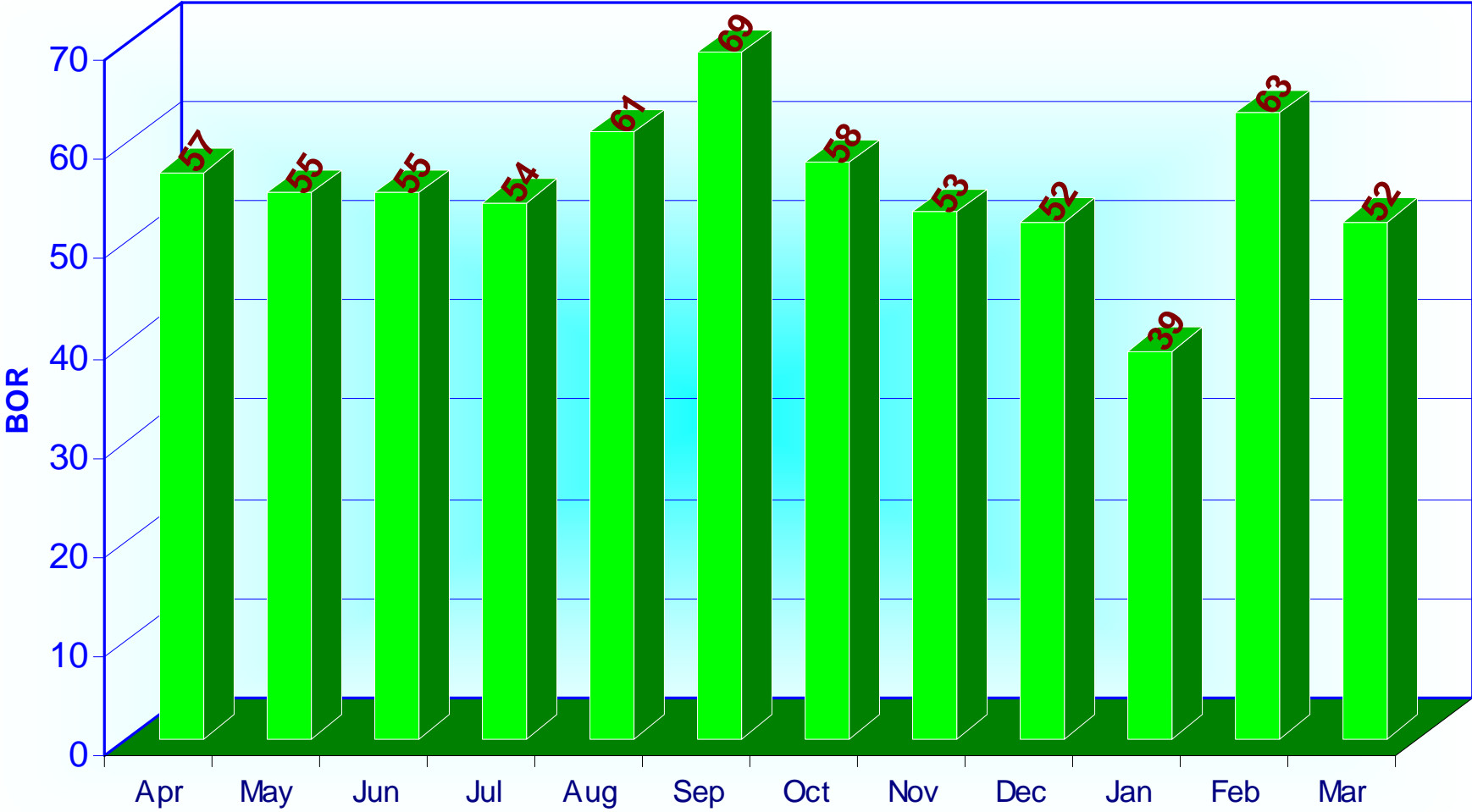


Oral & Dental Clinic (Oral Hygiene Includes Cliics)

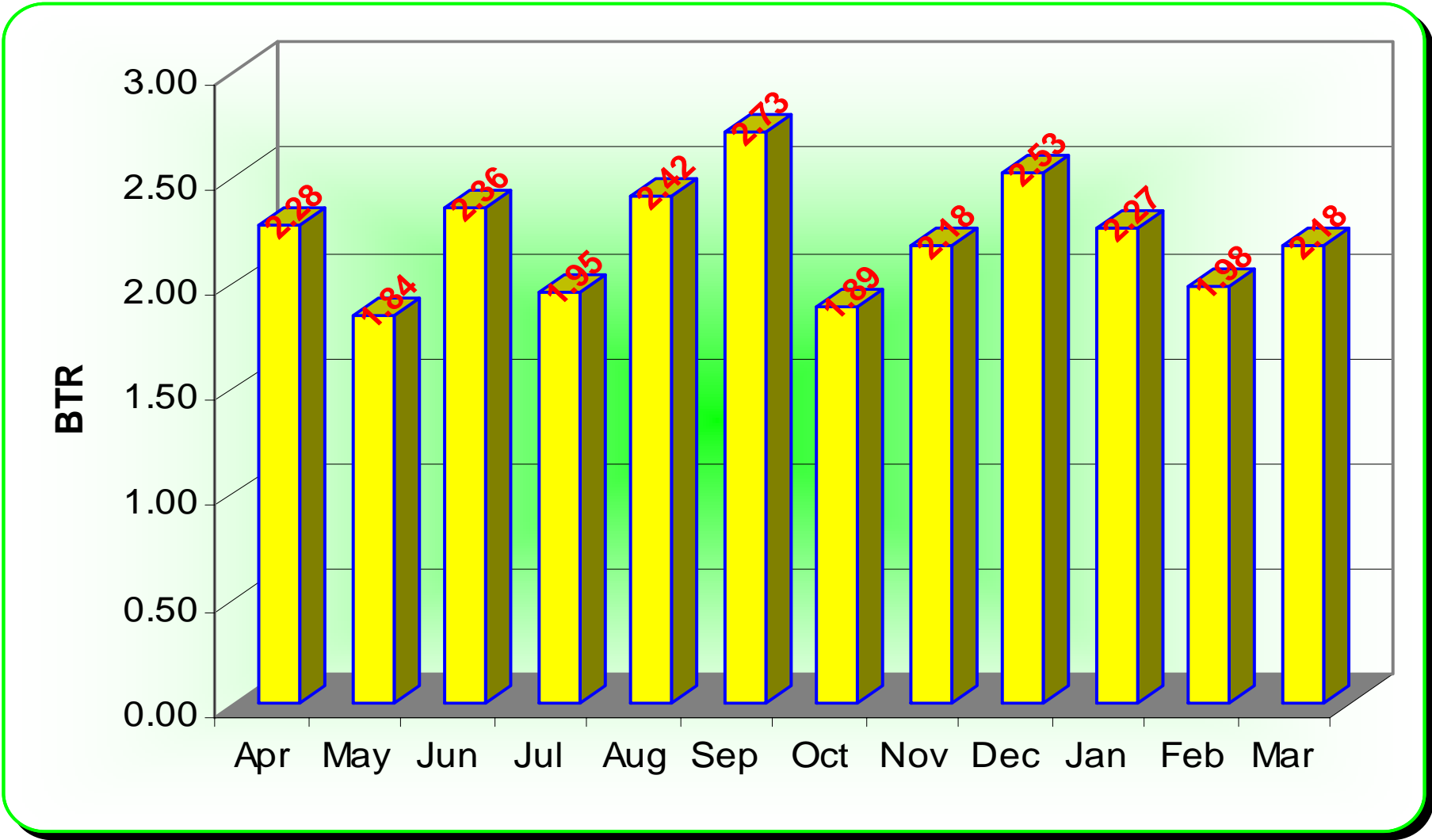

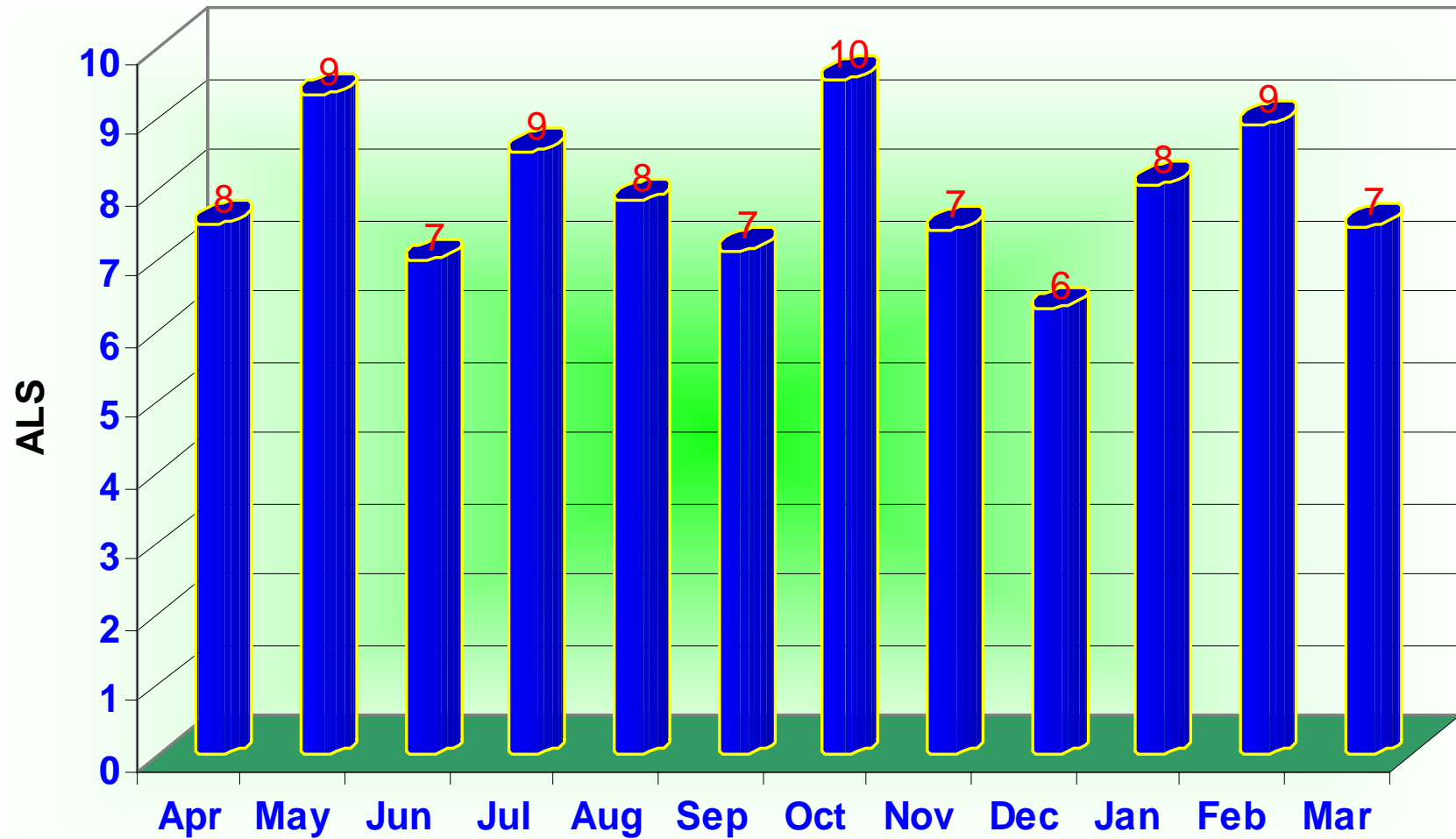
Bed Occupancy Rate



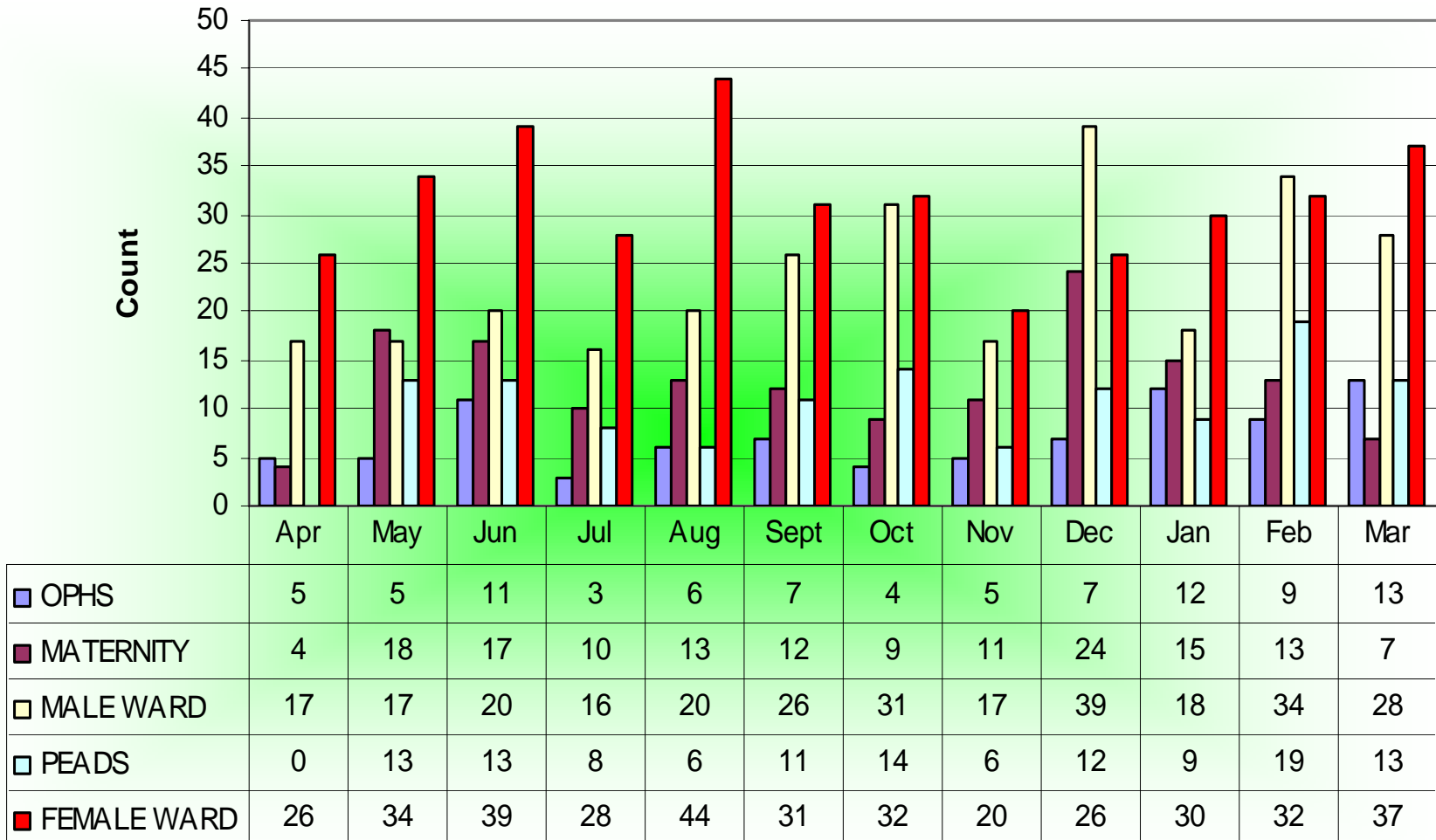
Bed Turnover Rate



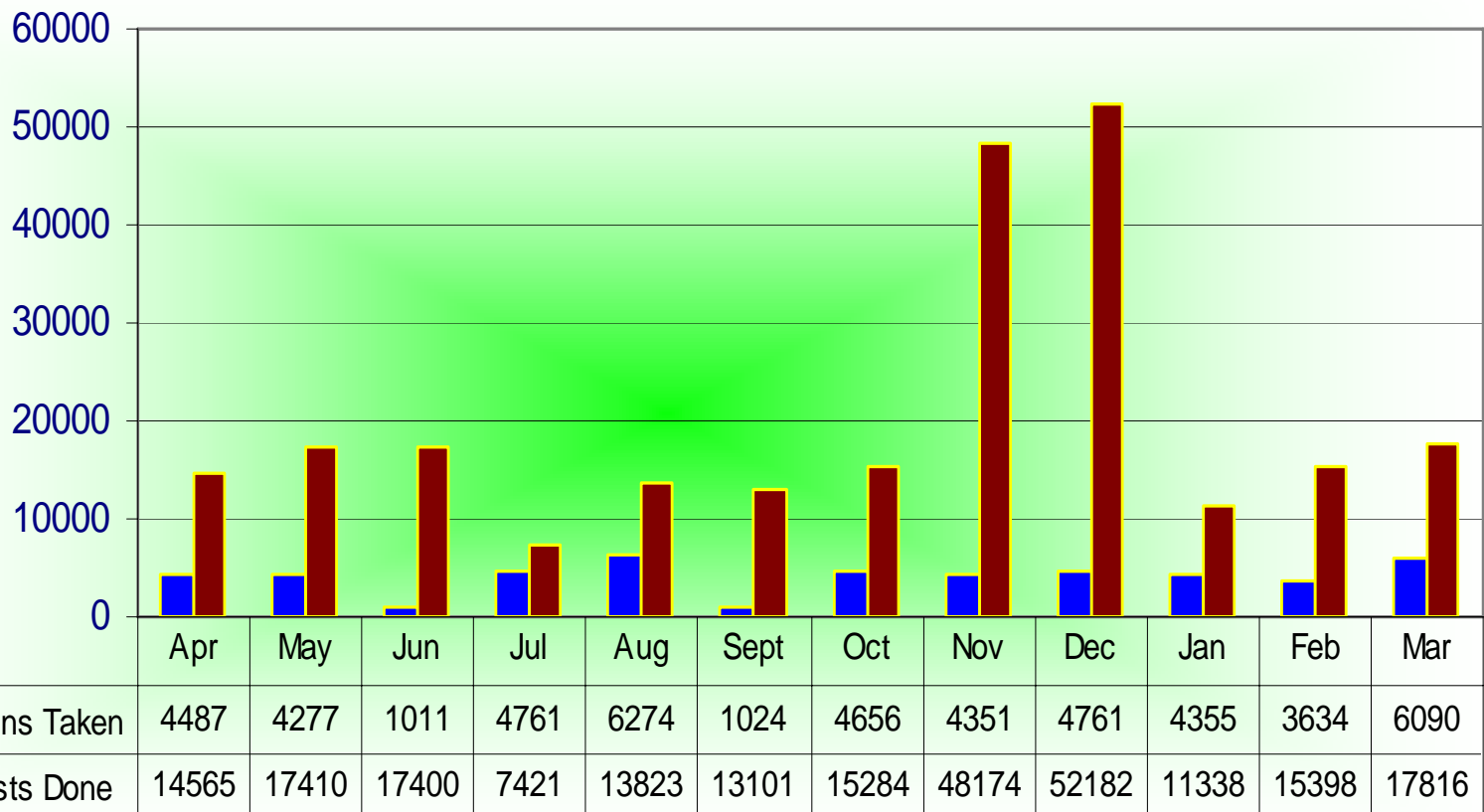
Average Length of Stay



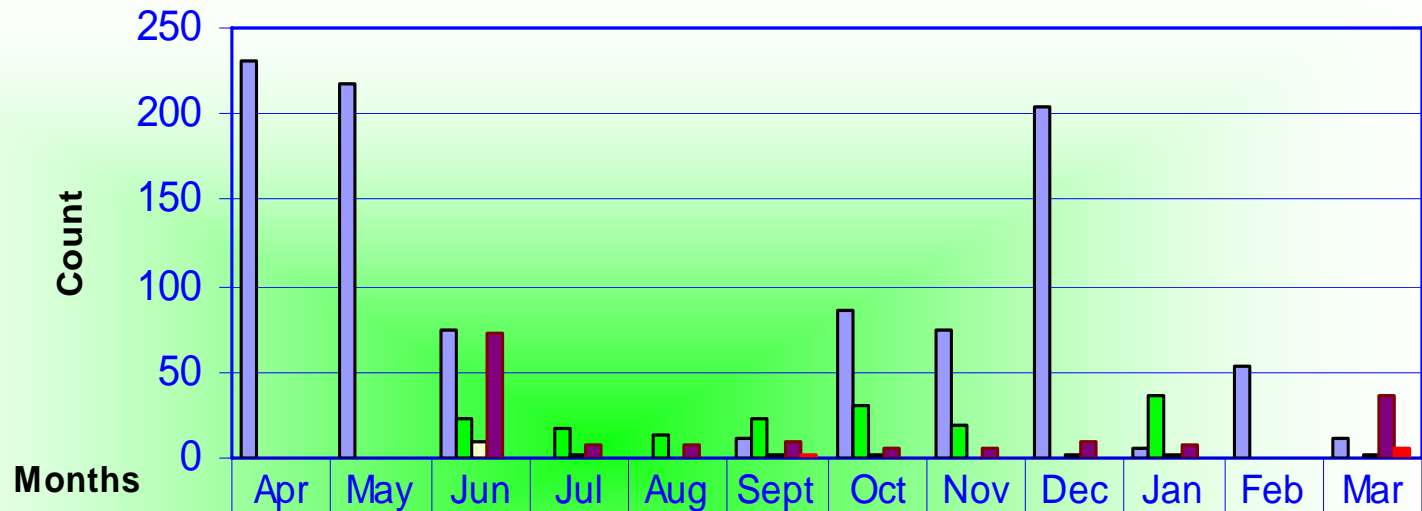
