PROJECT SPECIFICATION

The work to be carried out in terms of this section of the project comprises the supply and installation of all the materials necessary, as per the Schedule of Rates

PART 1

1. SCOPE OF WORK

- 1.1. Remove existing toilets and replace with Super white 'Viking' close couple type toilets complete with all necessary fittings and material.... See attachment.
- 1.2. Cistern to be secured to the wall using fixation bolts not smaller than 8mm and clear silicone to be used.
- 1.3. Seal, plaster and paint after installation, where necessary.
- 1.4. Poor workmanship and sub standard work will not be accepted.

PART 2

2.1 TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

This TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION shall be read in conjunction with all other sections of the SPECIFICATION and cognisance shall be taken of the clauses relevant to this particular work, whether any specific clauses are referred to or not.

PART 3

3.1. MATERIALS:

- 3.1.1. Proprietary materials where specified are to be of the brand specified or other approved by the Department (Viking close couple toilet,patent no: P2015/06505)
- 3.1.2. All the material to be used is to comply with the relevant **SANS** specification and in accordance with that manufacturer's instructions and be **SABS** approved.
- 3.1.3. Dimensions: Height-768mm, Length -690mm, Width-416mm, Weight-7.2kg, Code -570AP

3.2. PREPARATORY WORK:

3..2.1 All the preparatory work is to be included on pricing.

3,2,3 TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- -The contractor is to be in possession of all necessary tools and equipment to carry out this project.
- -The hospital tools, equipment and facilities will not be at the contractors disposal
- -All tools and equipment brought onto site by the contractor shall conform to the requirements of the occupational health and safety act (act 85 of 1993 as amended)
- 3.2.20 SITE CONDITION- The site is to be kept tidy at all times during the course of the project. On completion of the project the site shall be left neat and tidy with all rubbish and rubble removed from site by the contractor.

Installation Guide

- 1) Ensure that the installation area on floor is clean and level without any items that may impact the level of the pan.
- 2) Using the pan collar as your centre point, align the pan with the collar using a tape measure, measure from the centre of the toilet seat holes to the wall in order to ensure equal distances.
- 3) Once these measurements have been determined mark the holes on the base of the pan with your marker leaving a clear indication on the floor.
- 4) Using your power drill, drill the indicated areas to the correct depth taking into account the base of the toilet pan.
- 5) Place a generous amount of silicone around the base of the pan along with the fixation bolts and place into drilled holes.
- 6) Secure the bolts without over tightening them, as this may cause damage to the base of the pan.
- 7) Once the unit is securely set clean all excess silicone with a damp cloth creating a smooth seal between floor and the pan.
- 8) Once all waste and water points have been connected test the joints by flushing the toilet and ensure a leak free installation.
