6. STATEMENT OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

6.1. The contractor shall, when requested to do so, furnish particulars of supplies delivered or services executed. - Cleaning, repair or replacement of all damaged gutters around the building. b)
- Installation of kitchen cupboards (2,4 m length, 600 mm deep, 1 m high, complete with granite top, with sink and tap). Installation of new hinges for kitchen top shelves.
- Supply and installation of window blinds in 4 offices of similar size and type as the existing.

3 CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

3.1 Notice to Bidders

- a) The institutions will remain open and operational at all times therefore the Contractor shall make the necessary arrangements with the Institutional Management and maintenance staff for any power outages that are required. This may necessitate weekend work.
- The Administration reserves the right to negotiate prices in the Schedule of Prices.
- c) All redundant material and rubble shall be removed from the institution's property immediately.
- d) All equipment and materials used in this contract shall be that which is specified or other approved prior to submission and closure of the bid.
- e) The Contractor is advised to examine all the drawings (if any) and to visit the site prior to tendering to acquaint him/herself with the nature of the work to be done and access to the siting of the existing buildings etc., as no claim will be allowed on the grounds of ignorance of the conditions under which the work will be executed.
- f) Any discrepancies or omissions shall be brought to the attention of the Project Leader immediately.
- The Contractor must be registered with CIDB and must have minimum grading of 1 GB.
- h) The Contractor must be competent with proven experience in working in a building industry with traceable references.

3.2 Execution Period

Three (3) weeks is the specified completion period for the construction stage from the date of award.

4 PARTICULAR SPECIFICATION

4.1 General Requirements

Tenderers are to make special note of the following:

- a) The whole works shall be in accordance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act 85/1993 and all regulations framed therein shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Department of Health.
- b) Competent workmen skilled in their trade shall carry out all work.
- Quality shall be of the best standard practice and all workmanship will be subject to the approval of the Department of Health.
- d) The work shall at all times, for the duration of the contract, be carried out under the supervision of a skilled and competent representative of the Contractor, who will be able and authorized to receive and carry out instructions on behalf of the Contractor. A sufficient number of workmen shall be employed at all times to ensure satisfactory progress of the work.
- e) All apparatus, component parts, fittings and materials employed in the execution of the Contract shall be new and unused and shall be the latest type or pattern of the particular manufacture employed. S.A.B.S. mark bearing items shall be used wherever possible.
- f) The complete installation must be guaranteed against defective parts and workmanship for a period of twelve months (12) after the date of issue of the Completion Certificate.
- g) Tenderers are advised to visit the site and acquaint themselves fully with the site conditions and nature and full extent of work involved prior to submitting their tender. Claims on the grounds of insufficient information in such respects or otherwise will not be entertained by the Administration.
- h) The Department of Health reserves the right to make emergency repairs to keep the equipment in operation without voiding the Contractor's Guarantee, nor relieving the Contractor of his responsibility during the guarantee period when, after proper notice, the Contractor fails to attend to such emergency repairs. All costs incurred by the Administration under these circumstances will be for the account of the Contractor.
- i) NOTE: All electrical equipment shall comply with NER Regulation of voltage.

4.2 General Painting Requirements

The following is extracted from the KwaZulu Natal Department of Health Standard Preambles to All Trades, Revision 3, January 2009.

4.2.1 Painting Materials

- a) Proprietary materials where specified are to be of the brand specified or other approved by the Department.
- b) All primers, emulsion paints, enamels, stains, varnishes, etc. are to comply with the relevant SANS Specification.
- c) Paints, etc. shall be suitable for application on the surfaces to which they are being applied and those used externally shall be of exterior quality or suitable for exterior use.
- d) For any particular work the priming coat and subsequent coats of paint are to be executed with paints from the same manufacturer and in accordance with that manufacturer's instructions.
- e) The materials are to be brought to the site in unopened containers and no adulteration will be permitted, except thinners of a quantity and quality directed by the manufacturer.
- f) The Department shall at all times be permitted to take samples for testing purposes from open containers of any brand of paint being used on the work.
- g) All materials, if and when required by the Department, will be subject to tests by the South African Bureau of Standards, and the cost of such tests, should the material under test not meet the requirements of this specification, shall be borne by the Contractor.

h) Fillers and stoppings are to be suitable for use with the material being filled or stopped and to the approval of the Department.

4.2.2 Preparatory Work

- a) All new and existing surfaces are to be thoroughly dry and are to be cleaned of all dust, dirt, grease, oil, rust, scale, efflorescence, fungus, loose or flaking material, etc. rubbed down, stopped, filled, knotted and sanded smooth as required in accordance with the paint manufacturer's recommendations and to the approval of the Department prior to the application of paint, etc.
- b) Ceilings are to have nail heads, including those to cornices and cover strips, primed and stopped up as necessary and rubbed down smooth.
- c) In preparing existing glazed sashes and sash doors, all loose putty is to be removed, the rebates primed and glass resprigged and re-puttied as necessary before the painting is commenced.
- d) Where existing paint film are in good condition any flaking or bared patches are to be properly feathered into the surrounding paint and spot primed as necessary.
- e) Where existing paint films are in poor condition and require to be removed completely, they are to be removed by means of wire brushing, paint remover, burning off, or other approved method. Paint removers shall be free of wax and caustic substances and shall preferably be of water rinse-able type.
- f) The final state of preparatory work to existing decorated surfaces shall in all cases produce in the finished decorated surfaces a condition similar to new work.
- g) The Contractor will be held responsible for the proper and adequate preparation of the surfaces and any work which fails to meet the manufacturer's recommendations must be made good at the Contractor's expense to the satisfaction of the Department.

4.2.3 Application of Paints, Etc.

- a) Painting may be carried out by brush, roller or spray as recommended by the manufacturer and to the approval of the Department.
- b) All paints, etc. are to be applied in strict accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- c) Each coat of paint is to be adequately and permanently keyed onto the previous coat or surface and shall be evenly distributed and continuous and shall dry to a smooth film, free from sags, runs or other imperfections. Each coat of paint is to be of a colour distinctive from previous or succeeding coats.
- d) All painting must be done in accordance with a colour scheme which will be provided by the Department, and rates for painting etc. are to include for all cutting in of contrasting colours and masking as required.
- e) No distinction has been made where more than one colour of the same material is required on the walls or ceiling of the same room.
- f) Samples of colours for the final coats are to be prepared in all cases to the approval of the Department and all work must be finished to the approved colours.
- g) RATES: Rates for painting, etc. are to include for all preparatory work, and where spraying is employed, are to include or adequately masking all surrounding areas.
- h) Rates are to include for providing all necessary dust sheets, covers, etc. taking all necessary precautions to prevent marking the surfaces of joinery, walls, floors, glass, electrical fittings, etc.
- All surfaces disfigured or otherwise damaged shall be completely renovated or replaced as necessary to the approval of the Department at the Contractor's own expense.
- j) The colour of the painting for all areas (exterior walls, interior walls and ceiling, doors, etc.) shall as close as reasonable practicable match the existing colours in each area. The proposed colours are to be discussed with the client before commencement of works with the awarded contractor.

4.3 Electrical Installation Details

Satisfactory Installation:

a) All electrical work carried out will be neat and best class materials must be used. All wiring to conform to the SANS Code of Practice 10142 and will be subject to prior inspection and approval before acceptance. The Contractor shall submit the mandatory Certificate of Compliance.

4.4 Safety and Risk Management

 The Contractor shall observe all safety precautions during the project services as required by the OHS Act 85 of 1993 and manufacturer's recommendations.

4.5 Height Pass

 Wherever the work is required to be executed at higher elevations above the floor, the contractor shall arrange height pass for each and every person employed by him for this work for working at this elevation.

4.6 Man Power

- Experienced man power including supervisors, inspectors and painters shall be deployed on the work. The painters shall have to be qualified before start of work.
- A safety supervisor shall also be deployed for monitoring & instructing the safety aspects during the work.

4.7 Quality Assurance

- a) All works shall be conducted by fully trained and certificated artisans/apprentice.
- b) Certificates of artisans/apprentice performing the works to be supplied.
- The client representative shall conduct inspections of the works on completion.
- d) The manufacturer's recommendations and test procedures shall be strictly adhered to.
- e) The work of painting demands highest degree of quality and reliability standards. The workmanship shall be one of the best class achievable in the industry and acceptable to the client. Rectification of poor workmanship shall be done by the contractor to the satisfaction of the client.
- f) In line with the above requirement the contractor shall have documented quality assurance system to assure the quality of work at all stages.
- g) The contractor shall have qualified inspectors responsible for assuring quality assurance and quality surveillance at their works, their suppliers and at site.
