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
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



SPECIAL CONTRACT CONDITIONS OF QUOTATIONS

1. AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT

1.1. Any amendment to or renunciation of the provisions of the contract shall at all times be done in writing and shall be signed by both parties.

2. CHANGE OF ADDRESS

2.1. Bidders must advise the Department of Health (institution where the offer was submitted) should their address (domicilium citandi et executandi) details change from the time of bidding to the expiry of the contract.

3. GENERAL CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO THIS QUOTATION

- 3.1. The Department is under no obligation to accept the lowest or any quote.
- 3.2. The Department reserves the right to communicate in writing with vendors in cases where information is incomplete or where there are obscurities regarding technical aspects of the offer, to obtain confirmation of prices or preference claims in cases where it is evident that a typing, written, transfer or unit error has been made, to investigate the vendor's standing and ability to complete the supply/service satisfactorily.
- 3.3. ALL DECÍSIONS TAKEN BY THE DEPARTMENT ARE FINAL, INCLUDING THE AWARD OR CANCELLATION OF THIS QUOTATION.
- 3.4. The price quoted must include VAT (if VAT vendor).
- 3.5. Should a bidder become a VAT vendor after award or during the implementation of a contract, they may not request the VAT percentage from the Department as the service provider made an offer during the period they were not registered as a VAT vendor. The Department is only liable for any VAT from registered VAT vendors as originally stated on the quotation document.
- 3.6. The bidder must ensure the correctness & validity of the quotation:
 - (i) that the price(s), rate(s) & preference quoted cover all for the work/item (s) & accept that any mistakes regarding the price (s) & calculations will be at the bidder's risk
 - (ii) It is the responsibility of the bidder to confirm receipt of their quotation and to keep proof thereof.
- 3.7. The bidder must accept full responsibility for the proper execution & fulfilment of all obligations conditions devolving on under this agreement, as the Principal (s) liable for the due fulfilment of this contract.
- 3.8. This quotation will be evaluated based on the 80/20 points system, specification, correctness of information and/or functionality criteria.

 All required documentation must be completed in full and submitted.
- 3.9. Offers must comply strictly with the specification.
- 3.10. Only offers that meet or are greater than the specification will be considered.
- 3.11. Late offers will not be considered.
- 3.12. Expired product/s will not be accepted. All products supplied must be valid for a minimum period of six months.
- 3.13. Used/ second-hand products will not be accepted.
- 3.14. A bidder not registered on the Central Suppliers Database or whose verification has failed will not be considered.
- 3.15. All delivery costs must be included in the quoted price for delivery at the prescribed destination.
- 3.16. Only firm prices will be accepted. Such prices must remain firm for the contract period. Non-firm prices (including rates of exchange variations) will not be considered.
- 3.17. In cases where different delivery points influence the pricing, a separate pricing schedule must be submitted for each delivery point.
- 3.18. In the event of a bidder having multiple quotes, only the cheapest according to specification will be considered.
- 3.19. Verification will be conducted to identify if bidders have multiple companies and are cover-quoting for this bid.
- 3.20. In such instances, the Department reserves the right to immediately disqualify such bidders as cover-quoting is an offence that represents both corruption and acquisition fraud.

4. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND NOTICES TO BIDDERS REGARDING THE COMPLETION OF THIS QUOTATION.

- 4.1. Unless inconsistent with or expressly indicated otherwise by the context, the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and with words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and the neuter.
- 4.2. Under no circumstances whatsoever may the quotation/bid forms be retyped or redrafted. Photocopies of the original bid documentation may be used, but an original signature must appear on such photocopies.
- 4.3. The bidder is advised to check the number of pages and to satisfy himself that none are missing or duplicated.
- 4.4. Quotations submitted must be complete in all respects. However, where it is identified that information in a bidder's response, which does not affect the preference points or price, is incomplete in any respect, the said supplier meets all specification requirements and scores the highest points in terms of preference points and price, the Department reserves the right to request the bidder to complete/submit such information.
- 4.5. Any alteration made by the bidder must be initialled; failure to do so may render the response invalid.
- 4.6. Use of correcting fluid is prohibited and may render the response invalid.
- 4.7. Quotations will be opened in public as soon as practicable after the closing time of quotation.
- 4.8. Where practical, prices are made public at the time of opening quotations.
- 4.9. If it is desired to make more than one offer against any individual item, such offers should be given on a photocopy of the page in question. Clear indication thereof must be stated on the schedules attached.



4.10. The Department is under no obligation to pay suppliers in part for work done if the supplier can no longer for fulfil their obligation.

5. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING HAND DELIVERED QUOTATIONS

5.1. Quotation shall be lodged at the address indicated not later than the closing time specified for their receipt, and in accordance with the directives in the quotation documents.

5.2. Each quotation shall be addressed in accordance with the directives in the quotation documents and shall be lodged in a separate sealed envelope, with the name and address of the bidder, the quotation number and closing date indicated on the envelope. The envelope shall not contain documents relating to any quotation other than that shown on the envelope. If this provision is not complied with, such quotations/bids may be rejected as being invalid.

5.3. All quotations received in sealed envelopes with the relevant quotation numbers on the envelopes are kept unopened in safe custody until the closing time of the quotation/bids. Where, however, a quotation is received open, it shall be sealed. If it is received without a quotation/bid number on the envelope, it shall be opened, the quotation number ascertained, the envelope sealed and the quotation number written on the envelope.

3.4. A specific box is provided for the receipt of quotations, and no quotation found in any other box or elsewhere subsequent to the closing date and time of quotation will be considered.

5.5. No quotation/bid sent through the post will be considered if it is received after the closing date and time stipulated in the quotation documentation, and proof of posting will not be accepted as proof of delivery.

5.6. Quotation documents must not be included in packages containing samples. Such quotations may be rejected as being invalid.

6. SAMPLES

- 6.1. In the case of the quote document stipulating that samples are required, the supplier will be informed in due course when samples should be provided to the institution. (This decreases the time of safety and storage risk that may be incurred by the respective institution). The bidders sample will be retained if such bidder wins the contract.
- (i) If a company/s who has not won the quote requires their samples, they must advise the institution in writing of such.
- (ii) If samples are not collected within three months of close of quote the institution reserves the right to dispose of them at their discretion.
- 6.2. Samples must be made available when requested in writing or if stipulated on the document.

8. STATEMENT OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES


8.1. The contractor shall, when requested to do so, furnish particulars of supplies delivered or services executed. If he/she fails to do so, the Department may, without prejudice to any other rights which it may have, institute inquiries at the expense of the contractor to obtain the required particulars.

9. SUBMISSION AND COMPLETION OF SBD 6.1

9.1. Should a bidder wish to qualify for preference points they must complete a SBD 6.1 document. Failure by a bidder to provide all relevant information required, will result in such a bidder not being considered for preference point's allocation. The preferences applicable on the closing date will be utilized. Any changes after the closing date will not be considered for that particular quote.

10. TAX COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 10.1. In the event that the tax compliance status has failed on CSD, it is the suppliers' responsibility to provide a SARS pin in order for the institution to validate the tax compliance status of the supplier.
- 10.2. In the event that the institution cannot validate the suppliers' tax clearance on SARS as well as the Central Suppliers Database, the quote will not be considered and passed over as non-compliant according to National Treasury Instruction Note 4 (a) 2016/17.



TAX INVOICE

- 10.3. A tax invoice shall be in the currency of the Republic of South Africa and shall contain the following particulars:
- (i) the name, address and registration number of the supplier;
- (ii) the name and address of the recipient;
- (iii) an individual serialized number and the date upon which the tax invoice is issued;
- (iv) a description and quantity or volume of the goods or services supplied;
- (v) the official department order number issued to the supplier;
- (vi) the value of the supply, the amount of tax charged;
- (vii) the words tax invoice in a prominent place.

11. PATENT RIGHTS

The supplier shall indemnify the KZN Department of Health (hereafter known as the purchaser) against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

12. PENALTIES

- 12.1. If at any time during the contract period, the service provider is unable to perform in a timely manner, the service provider must notify the institution in writing/email of the cause of and the duration of the delay. Upon receipt of the notification, the institution should evaluate the circumstances and, if deemed necessary, the institution may extend the service provider's time for performance.
- 12.2. In the event of delayed performance that extends beyond the delivery period, the institution is entitled to purchase commodities of a similar quantity and quality as a substitution for the outstanding commodities, without terminating the contract, as well as return commodities delivered at a later stage at the service provider's expense.
- 12.3. Alternatively, the institution may elect to terminate the contract and procure the necessary commodities in order to complete the contract. In the event that the contract is terminated the institution may claim damages from the service provider in the form of a penalty. The service provider's performance should be captured on the service provider database in order to determine whether or not the service provider should be awarded any contracts in the future.
- 12.4. If the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the sorvices within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance.

13. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

- 13.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
- (i) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract,
- (ii) if the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (iii) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the
- 13.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services.
- 13.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

NOTES TO BIDDERS

1.1 GENERAL CONDITIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR PROCUREMENT

The KwaZulu-Natal Treasury's General Conditions and Procedures for Procurement (ZNT 6 – September 2002), copies of which are available from the offices of the Head: Works (as well as at http://www.kzntreasury.gov.za), will apply.

1.2 VISIT TO SITE

Bidders are advised to visit the site before quoting in order to satisfy themselves as to the nature and full extent of the work to be done and the conditions generally affecting the execution of the contract. Claims on the grounds of lack of knowledge in such respects or otherwise will not be entertained.

1.3 SUPERVISION

The work shall at all times, for the duration of the contract, be carried out under the supervision of a skilled and competent representative of the contractor, who will be able and authorized to receive and carry out instructions on behalf of the contractor. A sufficient number of workers shall be employed at all times to ensure satisfactory progress of the work.

1.4 PROTECTING AND MAKING GOOD

HEALTH AND SAFETY SPECIFICATION

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 85 OF 1993

EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS

- 1. Scope: This specification details the health and safety requirement with the Works.
- 2. Interpretations: Construction work is defined as: any work in connection with:
 - a) The erection, maintenance, alteration, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure;
 - b) The installation, erection, dismantling or maintenance of a fixed plant where such work includes the risk of a person falling; or
 - c) The moving of earth, clearing of land, the making of an excavation, piling or any similar type of work.
- **3.** <u>General:</u> The Employer will take reasonable steps to ensure that the contractor's health and safety plan is implemented and maintained. The steps taken will include periodic audits at intervals of at least once every month.

Should the Contractor at any stage in the execution of the work-

- a) Fall to implement or maintain contractors' health and safety plan;
- b) Execute construction work which is not in accordance with contractors' health and safety plan; or
- c) Act in any way which may poses a threat to the health and safety of any person/s, the Employer or employers' representative/agent will stop the Contractor from executing construction work.

4. General Requirements

- **4.1.** First Aid Equipment: The Contractor shall provide for its employees an approved first aid box. The first aid box to be checked weekly by a responsible person, who shall be appointed by the Contractor.
- 4.2. Reporting of incidents and /or injuries:
- 4.2.1. All incidents in respect of damage to Works, property or machinery or injury to persons, shall be reported by the Contractors Safety Officer or Site Representative to the Representative/agent by the quickest means possible.

- 4.2.2. A mandatory incident report form, containing full details of the incident, shall be completed and submitted to the representative/agent within (24) hours of the occurrence of the incident.
- 4.2.3. The representative/agent shall have the right to make all or any enquiries as to the cause and result of any such incident. The Contractor shall provide the representative/agent with full facilities for carrying out such enquiries.
- 4.3. <u>Danger Areas:</u> All danger areas shall be demarcated by the Contractor with appropriate tape and hazard notices to prevent unauthorized person/s entering the danger area.
- 4.4. <u>Hazard Notices:</u> The Contractor shall display hazard notices in all areas identified in the risk assessment as potentially hazardous.
- 4.5. <u>Personal Protective Clothing:</u> The Contractor shall provide the necessary personal protective clothing for his employees in hazardous areas, appropriate to the nature of the hazard identified in the risk assessment.

a) Hard Hats:

All employees of the Contractor shall wear hard hats in areas where appropriate hazard notices are displayed. Hard hats shall not be painted or otherwise defaced.

b) Eye Protection:

Suitable eye protection shall be worn in areas where appropriate hazard notices are displayed, or when grinding, chipping, breaking, drilling, arc welding, cutting with oxyacetylene equipment of similar activities are taking place.

c) Hearing Protection:

Suitable hearing protection shall be worn in areas where appropriate hazard notices are placed.

d) Foot Wear:

All employees of the Contractor shall wear undamaged, laced-up safety boots or safety shoes, suitable for the intended purpose, in prescribed areas where appropriate hazard notices are displayed.

e) Gloves:

All employees of the Contractors shall wear suitable gloves in all areas where appropriate hazard notices are displayed or when handling hot or hazardous materials or chemicals.

4.6. <u>Machine Guarding:</u> All power tools and machinery driven by belts, gears, ropes, chains, couplings and similar drives shall be adequately guarded. The Contractor shall prohibit the use of any equipment with a damaged, missing or inadequate guard.

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4.7. Ladders:

- 4.7.1. Every ladder shall be:
 - Of good construction, sound material and adequate strength and suitable to the purpose for which it is used (e.g. electricians shall use suitable insulated ladders),
 - Fitted with non-skid devices at the bottom of the stiles or with hooks or similar devices at the tops of the stiles.
- 4.7.2. Except for extension ladders, no ladder shall be used which is longer than 4,5m and no ladder shall have its reach extended by tying together two or more ladders.
- 4.7.3. All ladders shall be inspected weekly and a log shall be kept of the inspections.

2.1 EXTENT OF WORK/SPECIFICATION:

The work to be carried out in terms of this section of the project comprises the supply and installation of all the materials necessary, as per the Bill of Quantities and Drawings. The Department of Health Standard Preamble to All Trades Rev. 3 – January 2009 shall apply throughout.

1. **GENERALLY**

- 1.1 This specification calls for the development of the driveway and parking area at **Bhomela Clinic**.
- 1.2 The Department shall indicate on site, the position and area (in the extent of approximately (260m²) required to be surfaced.
- 1.3 Tenderers shall be responsible for taking all necessary measurements of the areas indicated by the Department. Claims on the grounds of incorrect information in such respects will not be entertained for any reason whatsoever.
- 1.4 The works shall be carried out in accordance with the following, as determined by the site conditions.

2. SITE CLEARANCE

7. PREMIX TARMACADAM SURFACING

7.1 Prime Coat: - When the base course is complete and dry it shall be cleaned of all loose material and be given a prime coat of one of the following primers:-

M.C. cut-back bitumen.

Tar Primer R.T.H. 3/P. Emulsion Primer (60%).

- 7.2 The rate of application of the primer shall be within the range 0.65 1.0 liter/m², the actual rate to be determined by test and observation on site. Where emulsion primer is used the application rate shall be increased to give the required net bitumen content.
- 7.3 Before spraying is commenced the surface shall be lightly watered to settle dust.
- 7.4 When the prime coat has dried a 25mm thick single coat premix course, shall be constructed.
- 7.5 Immediately after mixing, the surfacing materials must be spread and rolled on the same day. Spreading shall be done evenly over the base to ensure a consolidated thickness as specified.
- 7.6 Rolling shall commence as soon as the binder has set sufficiently.
- 7.7 Places inaccessible to a roller may be compacted by means of 12kg tampers. The surface shall be rolled true to line and level without slacks or irregularities.

8. KERBS

- 8.1 Generally: the kerbs are to be non-mountable and are to be laid before the base course is commenced to the lines and positions as Indicated by the hospital. The Contractor is to allow sufficient time for the mortar bedding and joints to set and is to take all necessary precautions to maintain the line of the kerbs especially while rolling the base course and surfacing, as no claims in this connection will be considered.
- 8.2 Rates for kerbs are to include for necessary excavation, well consolidated bottom under curbs and for filling and ramming to secure the curbs in position.
- Pre-cast Concrete kerbs shall be used and shall be as follows:- Pre-cast concrete curbs as SANS Fig. 8 are to be of concrete Class 20 (20 MPa) and cast generally in 1m lengths, and finished smooth off the mold on top edge and both sides, with angles rounded, and rates are to include for all necessary form-work and molds. The kerbs are to be bedded on and including a mat of 1:3 cement mortar, and the abutting ends of the curbs are to be fully jointed in a similar mortar and pointed with a keyed-in joint on top edge and exposed sides. Provide haunching for extra support. Total length of curbing is 60m.
