PEC is one of the common source of mechanism used to access patients/ clients in order to identify gaps for quality improvement in the health care facility. Also, it is used to get perception / gain insight from patient for measuring the level of satisfaction they experienced while visiting the facility.

All 09 Clinics and St Chads CHC were assessed (out patient survey) as we provide service to patients who receive medical treatment and return home.

Ladies and gentlemen, our clients has spoken. I am proud to announce that all facilities has done exceptional work and passed the PEC survey 2023/2024. Zoom in where the efficacy results were not met (access to care). Patient long waiting times can be detrimental to quality service the facility is providing and can negatively impact on patient experience of care by increasing number of complaints verse compliments received.

While the Management and Supervisors are timeously working to reduce patient waiting times and proving quality care services, staff members are urged to be loyal, dedicated, motivated to their daily duties.

There are ways our facility can reduce patient waiting times. As some of the clients are complaining about staff taking lunch at once. Operational Managers/ Supervisors to have allocation for breaks - staff to rotate when taking lunch.

Using of cellphone while on duty can also delay time for patients, therefore staff are urged to adhere to SOP restricting staff to use cellphones while on duty. Not unless its work related. Well done to Human Resources Development for continuously organizing Induction and Orientation to newly employed staff. Staff to adhere to Code of Codes, Ethics and professionalism and practice Batho Pele principles.

There are services and systems in place to reduce waiting time. Patient Registration to strengthen HPRS capturing system. Clinicians to enroll stable clients to Central Chronic Medicines Dispensing Distribution (CCMDD) and Pelo box.

Getting lost in the facility while searching for an Audiologist can delay a patient stay in the facility. Therefore, triaging patients to avoid disorganization of clients, have an active help desk and updated signage and correct colour coding can assist clients.

Staff members, do not get tired to emphasize the importance of honoring appointment system to clients. This can be a win- win to both patients and facility.

Senior Management can not decrease patient waiting time without staff member's effort and commitment to their work.

Back to the basics

Hand wash your hands to protect the spread of infection

Slogan : Clean Hands Are Within Reach





n the 20th October 2023, St Chads CHC joined forces to motivate and encourage staff members to adhere to the good hand hygiene practice. Mr Themba Sitole-Infection Prevent Coordinator led the facility to ensure that staff members curb the spread of infection from one person to another or from surface to a person.

The campaign aimed to increase awareness and understanding the critical importance of handwashing to prevent the spread of contiguous diseases. "Thorough handwashing with soap and water or with hands with alcohol based hand rub can protect you and your patients from the range of infection", said Themba Sitole when he was emphasizing hand wash and hand rub at Casualty Unit.

During the campaign, staff were encouraged to rub hands for at least 15 - 20 seconds.

Five moments to be observed by health professionals:

Moment 1: Before touching a patient. Moment 2: Before septic procedure. Moment 3: After body fluid exposure. Moment 4: After touching a patient. Moment 5: after touching a patient's surroundings.

We are all aware of the current global economy crisis and that we as public servants should do more with the little budget that we have to ensure that Health Care Services are provided to the citizens of the country.

The budget has drastically been reduced from the previous years, in 2022/23 the total budget for St Chads CHC was RR279,452,000, the current budget for 2023/24 is R270 088 000.00 as you can see the current budget has been reduced by R9 364 000.00 as compared to last financial year

Even though the budget is much less, we ensure that services are not hampered by ensuring stock availability, infrastructure maintenance is carried out and staff shortages is reduced by us adhering to the acts and policies which are available and which guides us on how we should provide services to our clients so that the Departments objectives can be achieved

The Departments objectives are:

Universal Health Coverage- to increase access, quality and uniformity.

Reduce morbidity and mortality Improve client experience of care The following are legislative prescripts and policies: PFMA, Treasury Regulations, PPPFA, BBBEE, BCOE, Public Service Act, Code of Conduct but to mention a few which are applicable to The Department of Health.

The PFMA chapter 5, section 45, **Responsibilities of other officials**: An official in a department, trading entity or constitutional institution-

Must ensure that the system of financial management and internal control established for that department, trading entity or constitutional institution is carried out within the area of responsibility of that official;

- Is responsible for the effective, efficient, economical and transparent use of financial and other resources within that official's area of responsibility;
- Must take effective and appropriate steps to prevent, within that officials area of responsibility, any unauthorised expenditure, irregular expenditure and fruitless and wasteful expenditure and any under collection of revenue due;
- Must comply with the provisions of this Act to the extent applicable to that official, including any delegations and instructions in terms of section 44; and
- Is responsible for the management, including the safeguarding, of the assets and the management of the liabilities within that official's area of responsibility.

Failure of any official to comply with the PFMA is considered as Financial Misconduct and is convicted to a fine or to imprisonment not exceeding five (05) years.

St Chads CHC is a team which is striving to achieve the departments objectives and if continue working together we will achieve the NDP30

As a Department, we have also received an un-qualified audit report for the 2022/23 for the first time in 17 years which proofs that continuing to work together and adhering to acts and policies we can achieve a clean audit.

NB: If we take some time to do things right the first time and we work SMART not hard, we will achieve the Departments Objective.

What is a health facility without medication

Pharmacy Month: on Thursday 5th October 2023, St Chads CHC celebrated a Pharmacy month to recognize the impact Pharmacy make to patients.

The theme "*Pharmacy United in Promoting Healthcare for Patients*" aims to educate the public on the role of pharmacists and pharmacy support personnel in delivering primary healthcare services to the community, promoting the uptake of immunization and educating the public on adverse drug identification and reporting; and promoting antimicrobial stewardship , including infection prevention and control (IPC).

Pharmacy together with Chronic Unit and Mother and Child united to educate patients about the methods to avoid contracting infections like wearing of surgical masks when visiting healthcare facility, side effects caused by medication, emphasized the importance of completing the antibiotic course and adherence to immunization required.

"Completing the entire coarse of antibiotic is very vital to ensure that the bacteria is killed and it eradicate the body", said Safia Mahomed - Community Service (CS Pharmacy). She further said that discounting antibiotic consumption can worsen the infection.

Nkosinathi Ndlovu, (CS Pharmacist) also took a stand to urged the health workers to explain side effects to the patients and for patients to ensure they understand the side effects of medication they are taking.

Prevention measures to protect our children from communicable diseases like polio and measles is to ensure that children comply with all immunization. Lebo Mofokeng (CP Pharmacy) emphasized the importance of childhood immunization to avoid communicable diseases.

It is anticipated that pharmacy will continue to educate, serve and care for the public on the importance of health issues.

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

NATIONAL STROKE Week

Recognising these signs is important for quick action. The acronym F.A.S.T. is an easy way to remember them:

- FACE DROOPING: Check if one side of the face is drooping or feels numb. Ask the person to smile and see if their smile looks uneven.
- ARM WEAKNESS: See if one arm is weak or numb. Ask the person to raise both arms and note if one arm drifts downward.
- SPEECH DIFFICULTY: Listen carefully for slurred speech or trouble speaking. The person may have difficulty finding the right words or speaking clearly.
- 🍼 TIME: Call, seek help at first sight of stroke.
