The annual World Sight Day commemoration was a resounding success. This event was the highlight of the International Eye Care week that involved a number of activities.

The Guest Speaker, Councillor Fawzia Peer, Chief Whip in eThekweni Municipality. Councillor Fawzia thanked the Department of Health and St Aidan's Mission Hospital for offering such a valuable service to the people of eThekweni Municipality.

She also highlighted how people blessed with the gift of sight take for granted the challenges faced by the people with visual problems.

One of the speakers Mr John Foster spoke at length about the retinal problems and how people with such problems should look after themselves.

About 62 patients underwent cataract surgery. They were quite grateful of the outcomes as it saved them from imminent blindness. There were also about 365 people who had their eyes screened for a variety of eye problems. 138 people received glasses. All these services were done free of charge.

The crowds were entertained by the children from the KwaZulu-Natal Society for the Blind.
