he health of our community within the district is important and a priority to health care workers. Therefore the Department of Health has prioritized Primary Health Care (PHC) services with an extension of Community Based Services (CBS). The District has increased the number of nurses visiting households within the catchment population of each clinic. The schools are also visited by School Health Teams (SHT) to provide preventative and promotive health services.

It is therefore crucial that the above mentioned personnel is known by key stakeholders where they are working. The school health teams were involved in the measles and HPV campaigns in February and March 2023. Qoqoqo campaigns are scheduled by the very same teams on quarterly basis.

ZN MEC for Health, Ms Nomagugu Simelane, will on Sunday 25 June 2023, in Partnership with Siyabonga Sangweni Foundation hold community Imbizo to engage the destitute communities who has been calling for different services from the government under the OSS umbrella including Isibhedlela Kubantu. One of the Department of Health's core preventive care measure and mandate is that of engaging, informing and educating the public through Community Outreach Programmes on health matters. Evidence shows that adolescents face a number of health and social challenges, which puts them at a higher risk of unwanted pregnancy, unsafe abortion and sexually transmitted infections and substance abuse. The province has a significantly high rate of drug abuse, teenage pregnancy and other social ills, which often go with unemployment and poverty. Through this programme the community and the youth in particular will be encouraged to play an active role in their respective communities when it comes to addressing social ills such as substance and drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, crime, and rape. Through Isibhedlela Kubantu the public is encouraged to use health services. MEC will also ensure that vulnerable community very far from our health institutions enjoy all health service, strategically focusing on HIV prevention and STIs. This gathering will also serve to alert the public about gender-based violence; Cholera, mumps, malaria alert; vaccination programme; sexual assaults and crimes. It will also share the challenges that are faced by vulnerable people in their household and in the community where they live. It is also aimed at encouraging people to lead a healthy lifestyle by sticking to a balanced diet and by taking care of their bodies through physical exercise and training.

King Cetshwayo District TB Blitz at Mvutshini Obanjeni under Catherine Booth District Hospital

atherine Booth District Hospital is located in uMlalazi sub-district and this facility is having TB high loss to follow up rate around 14% with death rate of 18%. King Cetshwayo District TB Management team decided to coordinate all TB teams under King Cetshwayo District to converge in few community areas under Catherine Booth for case finding activity through a TB Blitz project. This

finding activity through a TB Blitz project. This was done with an aim of maximizing efforts and increase coverage scope to track, trace and find missing cases at a community level. This Blitz was conducted during World TB month which is March of every year. TB Blitz Campaign was coordinated on the 13th to the 17th of March 2023 to sensitize, create and increase awareness of the scourge of TB, Covid 19 and HIV around the catchment area of Catherine Booth District Hospital in two areas which is Mvutshini under Nzuza Tribal Authority and Obanjeni under

Ogagwini Tribal Authority.

The critical objectives of this TB Blitz were to find missing TB/HIV patients in theses identified communities through a door to door program approach. As indicated before that these areas under Catherine Booth District Hospital has a high number of loss to follow up TB clients in these areas was going to assist in tracing of TB contacts, find TB clients who have been lost to follow up. Empowerment of these communities with information about TB and HIV, so that community members can make informed decisions and easily able to identify signs & symptoms of TB and come forward for screening and testing. Promotion of TB and HIV treatment compliance, promote prevention strategies of contracting TB: Open Windows, Cough Hygiene and adoption of healthy lifestyle, Preventative Therapy for HIV positive people.

THE EXPECTED OUTCOMES WERE: An increased awareness about TB, an increased awareness of the importance of treatment adherence, Addressing issues that prevent people from retaining in care and Enhanced awareness on preventative measures to prevent the spread of TB.

King Cetshwayo Health district has 5 clinics dedicated to men's health namely Nseleni CHC under City of UMhlathuze, with its site located inside Nseleni Taxi Rank, this clinic is run by a male clinician Monday to Wednesday attending to all male conditions within his scope and making referrals where necessary, the Thursday and Friday He attends specifically a men's health project called Voluntary male medical circumcision. Thokozani clinic under the City of UMhlathuze with its site located inside Thokozani clinic with a dedicated male clinician attending to only males in their consulting room, the clinic runs Monday to Friday. Melmoth clinic under Mthonjaneni Local Municipality with a consulting room inside the facility that is dedicated to males,

this clinic runs Monday to Friday. Mpandleni clinic at Nkandla Local Municipality with a male clinician dedicated to assist male clients Monday to Friday. Eshowe Phila Ndoda clinic at UMlalazi Local Municipality, the site is located inside the the taxi rank and is run by male clinicians Monday to Friday. Ongoing plans are underway to expand these services in the entire district.

Amongst other male targeted interventions the district have 6 Sub-district male circumcision coordinators employed permanently and 5 traditional coordinators employed on the contract basis which work with contracted doctors and Ngo's in our district in scaling up male medical circumcision. Above 14000 males were circumcised in the last financial year alone.

THE IMPORTANCE OF OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

What is Occupational health and safety (OHS) is the practice that deals with safety, welfare, and social wellbeing of workers in all occupations. Hence, providing a safe working environment for staff is a legal and human resource responsibility.

The International Labour Organization (ILO) estimates that every year around 2.3 million workers around the world face fatal circumstances due to work related accidents that is why public and private sector organizations throughout the world are increasingly concerned with improving occupational health and safety.

The rapid pace of technological and natural changes, combined with the persistence of unsafe and environmentally threatening workings conditions, has served to focus attention on the requirement to make a secure, healthy operating environment, and push coherent safety culture within the workplace.

Why is Occupational health and safety program important?

Help including to identifying hazards in the workplace and determining the risk associated with them, designing the facility and management program to reduce risks associated with the hazards, and communicating hazard identification, risk assessment, and appropriate safety measures to all employees.

The staff needs to know that management is concerned about their welfare, for both new and long-established institutions.

The implementation of occupational health and safety standards helps the institutions to reduce the workplace incidents, to find possible safety concerns before they cause an accident. Also the reduction of absenteeism and staff turnover by managing health and safety hazards in the work place more effectively. Lastly it helps with the prevention of potential Patient Safety Incidents in the facilities which can lead to health hazards and litigations there off .

EMS and FPS Wellness days

Natal are claiming lives of the province's citizens. These fatalities account for most of the unnatural deaths in KwaZulu Natal. The financial year end of 2021 saw KZN province recording 289 fatalities; the release of statistics of road fatalities for the financial year end 2019/2020. The Province recorded 289 fatalities from 1 December 2020 to 11 January 2021. All these statistics show how much emotionally and psychologically burdened our Emergency Medical Services and Forensic Pathology Services. The spiritual and psychosocial support was launched by Employee and Wellness Directorate in King Cetshwayo District on the 5th of May 2023 at King Dinuzulu Hall in Eshowe.

This service is performed by paramedics on the scene of the accident or unnatural incident. Paramedics perform rescue operations of person (s) and or certify the death. If death has occurred, the second cohort of healthcare workers take over. Forensic Pathology Services personnel are responsible for the removal and transportation of the deceased to the Forensic Mortuary for the administration of Post mortem. Critical in all of this is that all of the duties associated with Emergency medical rescue services and Forensic Pathology Services are traumatic in nature. The EMS and FPS workforce face this fate for the most part of their work.
