




Appelsbosch Hospital newsletter

LOOKING BACK AND FORTH BY MEDICAL MANAGER

The end of 2009 is fast approaching and with so many commitments and challenges in front of us is difficult to find time to reflect.

During the past twelve months a number of initiatives have been taken by our wonderful clinical team.

As our first priority the comprehensive management and care of HIV patients has being at the forefront of our efforts. Just to mention a few of the achievements:

- More than 3000 patients have been already initiated on HAART since December 2004.
- We have secured support from EGPAF (NGO) and acquired a park-home facility with furniture and equipment that already hosts antenatal care and PMTCT all under one roof.

- The early and effective implementation of Dual Therapy for PMTCT has already dramatically decreased the HIV mother to child transmission rate to figures below 7%.
- EGPAF has also supported with nursing staff and with one pharmacist and one pharmacist assistant whom will run a satellite pharmacy, for ARV patients.
- The down-referral of patients on HAART to their nearest clinic (Gcumisa) has continued and consolidated this year and to our delight and also with the support of our District Office and EGPAF initiation of patients on ARV has commenced in Gcumisa Clinic since April 2009 with more than 200 patients already enrolled.

During the next twelve months we should continue working hard to enable the down-referral process to the remaining PHC facilities and possibly initiation of patients on ARVs in all those clinics. Issues around treatment compliance and adherence are priority to our ARV roll out program and will be high in our agenda for 2010 and beyond.

We should also mention the opening of our Dental Clinic this year and the efforts made by our Community Service Dentist, Dr. Naidoo to commence this very valuable service for our clients.

Construction for our new state of the art Operating Theater has gather pace and we are looking forward to the opening next year.

Other programs such as Nutrition and Rehabilitation have been making great progress in the past twelve months thanks to a dynamic and energetic team of professionals that have improved the quality of our clinical services.

Awareness days, open days and outreach programs have been brilliantly done despite severe financial constrains.





The HOPE program led by Dr.Narainswami has developed with particular emphasis on involving traditional healers and other community representatives.




For those who've passed, infected and affected: A candlelight memorial


THE "LEARNING CURVE" CORNER
