The focus for 2023 is amongst others the acceleration of socio-economic programmes and activities that are undertaken across different economic sectors to fast track gender mainstreaming across these.

Ms Zamambo Mkhize (Secretary to the CEO) was the programme director for this prestigious event. Mrs Gaga (Operational Manager at Gateway Clinic) opened with a very moving verse from the book of Exodus and then Ms Mthembu (Deputy Manager Nursing) welcomed all the ladies and encouraged them to enjoy themselves since it was their special day.
