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
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STRATEGIC WORKSHOP

HGRH held its annual Strategic Planning Workshop on the 19th - 20th of April 2023 at Greys Hospital. Strategic planning is a process in which an organization's leaders define their vision for the future and identify their organization's goals and objectives. The process includes establishing the sequence in which those goals should be realized so that the organization can reach its stated vision. The workshop was honored by the presence of Rev S Shangase who opened with a powerful message from the Christian Bible.


The presentation made on the workshop included Thinking Styles, Provincial strategies, District plan, hospital/PHC budget and hospital key focus areas.

On arrival, I was given a report that: He tolerated his breakfast (Yoghurt and boiled eggs), Medication given orally (Crushed tablets). My assessment: Needs assessment according to human basic needs. Blanket Bath and Mouth Care; this was done collectively with the team of Priests x 2 and Comboni Brothers scholastics at Cedara. Requirements were collected for the above mentioned activities, GOOD TEAM WORK, working together all the way. Privacy was in pie order blanket bath was given to the Priest as well as mouth care, Nurse Patient Relationship was the order of the day. On completion he verbalized "NGIYABON-GA" that was His last words. He then struggled to breath, team members were summoned and we all agreed that NETCARE 911 is called, on arrival after quick response; resuscitation took place and it was unsuccessful. He rested in Peace at His Parish Home St Joan of Arc: Sgujana.
