DEFINITION AND IMPORTANCE

- Detailed assessment of deaths during a defined period
- Information systematically collected
 - Significance no. of deaths
 - cause of deaths
 - avoidable factors
 - how to prevent this in the future!!!

Steps involved

- Documenting the no. of deaths
- Collecting the basic information on people who died
- Calculating the mortality rates
- Determining the causes of mortality
- Looking at avoidable factors and missed opportunities
- Planning ways to prevent deaths in the future

How can you determine how a pt died?

- History
- Examination of the patient
- Special Investigations
- Post Mortem Examination

Steps Involved in Setting Up a Mortality Meeting

- Time and venue
- All relevant staff to attend
- · Chairperson, secretary
- Selection of cases from list of deaths
- Summary of clinical record
- Standardized format of presentation
- Discussions around problems and avoidable factors

- How Often?
- Depends on size of hospital weekly every few days, monthly
- Notes?
- Detailed, accurate notes must be kept for each case discussed
- Deaths Discussed as follows –
- Primary and final causes
- Avoidable factors, missed oppor or substandard care.
- Mx Plan to prevent similar occurrence

Problems that may be encountered

- Pts dying at home after D/C
- Staff cannot attend
- Individual staff may feel threatened if problems of Mx are discussed
- Problems of confidentiality may occur
- May become a witch hunt to find staff that made the mistake
- Pt notes lost or incompltete
- Cases and data not prepared properly
- Lessons learned are not used to improve care
