
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TRAUMA DAY 2023

Trauma is the emotional reaction to any event that has an impact on a person's physical and mental health, such as mishaps, injuries, sexual assault, natural catastrophes, or rape. Because it was Trauma Day commemoration, the King Dinuzulu Hospital Complex Trauma Unit chose to concentrate on providing CPR training to patients and visitors. The demonstration and in-service took place at the foyer, and patients were given the chance to showcase new skills they had learned that day. Why Is Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Important? Life-saving CPR is possible. This approach is a first-line response that might potentially save a person's life in an emergency. Its goal is to maintain oxygen flow to essential organs, particularly the brain, until the heart can beat on its own again
