DISTRIBUTION OF WHITE CANES

roviding assistive devices to clients with limitations/ disabilities is one of the key responsibilities of the Occupational therapy department.

On the 11th of May 2023 the Occupational therapy department organized for the distribution of whitecanes for the visually impaired patients that have previously been assessed. A collaborative effort with the Occupational therapy department at Ngwelezana hospital and the Community Based Rehabilitation Workers placed within the Ngwelezana area, Esikhaleni area and Nseleni area, and as well as the Disability forums within uMhlathuze municipality and uMfolozi municipality assisted in the identification of some of the patients in the community.

The mandate for this initiative was that for the distribution of the white canes. Patients should have been previously trained on orientation and mobility, and require re-issue of their white canes

The Department of Health together with a state funded organization known as South African Mobility Trust for the Blind were part of this initiative to distribute the white canes as well living with a visual impairment, as as to raise awareness of their training she is also visually impaired . programming for persons with visual impairment within the King Cetshwayo District.

ne of the major cancers treated at Ngwelezana Tertiary Hospital Oncology Clinic is breast cancer.

Mastectomy forms an integral part of treatment for many of the patients diagnosed with breast cancer. This procedure has a significant impact on patient's body image and confidence.

Reach For Recovery, an NGO which assists cancer patients, sponsored silicone breast prostheses for 18 patients who have completed their cancer treatment and are currently in remission.

The Oncology Clinic staff arranged a small celebration gathering for these ladies on the 14th of July 2023 as they received their prosthesis and celebrated this significant milestone in their treatment journey.









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
