Obesity may lead to arthritis, Rheumatology Department warns...

Osteoarthritis, also known as degenerative joint disease, is the most common form of arthritis. It is a long-term disease of the joint cartilage and bone, commonly thought to result from "wear and tear" on a joint. There are also other causes, such as some birth defects, trauma, and metabolic disorders.

In a recent event held on the November 12, 2008 which saw the hosting of Rheumatology Department officials from Inkosi Albert Luthuli Central Hospital. Prof. Mody, one of the guest speakers drew the sufferers of arthritis to special ex-

ercises which may be taken by patients suffering from the disease. "A series of other remedies may be taken to curb the disease e.g. maintaining a normal Body Mass Index (BMI), exercising and eating a healthy diet" Prof. Mody told the attendees of Osteoarthritis Awareness Event.

Sr Mkhize and Ntombifuthi who were with the Rheumatology team shared the podium testifying about the disease reiterating and demonstrating what Prof. Mody had said. The two hour event meant to pass the message, "asilweni nesifo

samathambo, sindawonye" (Let us fight arthritis today) and was also to capacitate clinicians on how best to manage the disease. A Lecture by the Rheumatology Department was held with all the clinicians in attendance.

Social welfare/security services were also made available such as South African Social Security Services (SASSA) pension matters and education of pension applicants processes was conducted by SASSA's Local Office Manager, Mr Sam Zungu whilst screening and minor ailments services were rendered at our Gateway Clinic.

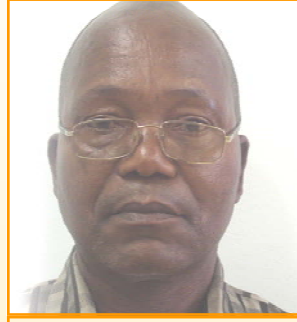

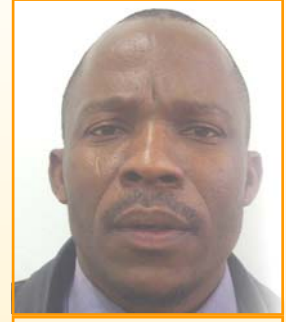

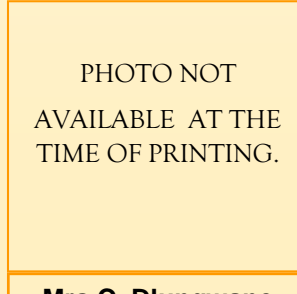

MEC's Launch the Sisonke Economic Projects

The MEC for Finance and Economic Development, Dr Zweli Mkhize visited the Sisonke District on Thursday, 20 November 2008 to launch cluster projects amongst many others was the stimela (coal train) project.

Dr Mkhize was accompanied by Agriculture MEC, Mr Mtholephi Mthimkhulu, Art and Culture MEC Mrs Weziwe Thusi and Senior Government officials. They arrived at the Creighton area in the early hours of the day to visit various projects before the Community event which was held at Zidweni Location in Kilmun.

The government delegation started the day in the local municipality (Ingwe) then proceeded to launch the stimela project before MEC for Agriculture Mr Mtholephi Mthimkhulu turned the sod for the construction of a small bridge which is said to help the local communities. This was followed by the opening of a cultural centre in Bulwer which was then followed by a visit to local farms with the aim of situation analysis of both the farms and living conditions of the farm workers. The visit to the farms is as the results of recent

natural disasters such as running fires, drought and floods which claimed people's lives and left malicious damages to land and agricultural property in the province. When MEC for Finance and Economic Development, Dr Zweli Mkhize addressed masses in an event which hosted about 15 000 Local community members, he emphasised with the affected community amid recent natural disasters.

He said that the visit by the provincial delegation was a positive gesture by government to redress the community affected. "We have brought economic development to uplift the lives of people in Sisonke District" Dr Mkhize told the masses as he was giving the keynote address. He also encouraged people to actively participate to uplift their lives by ensuring that government property is safe and not vandalized. "People need to take ownership of government property in their area" MEC Mkhize added.

Masses were bestowed with gifts such as soccer kits to existing soccer teams in the area and craft material to the physically challenged groups with existing craft

and beads projects.

As if that was enough, the MEC handed over title deeds to local groups and undertook to offer assistance in developing their lands agriculturally. Agricultural and other assistive devices were also handed out to local groups. And as a government norm, social and health services were showcased and were offered by the South African Social Security Agency (SASSA), Department of Health's St. Apollinaris Hospital and Department of Home Affairs.

Local Municipality Mayor Ms N.P. Luzulwane and Inkosi M. Dlamini welcomed all endeavours made to uplift their communities and thanked the political principals for heeding their call to visit the area. District Mayor Cllr. Khoza reiterated the latter in a closing speech to close the event.
