We are in December, about to wrap up 2022. Not long ago we were ushering in the new year, lamenting that this will be a long year. Little did we know that it will fly by. This has not been an easy joyful year. However, we have a lot to be thankful for. When the year started it was compulsory to wear masks in public places because of COVID-19 (it is still mandatory to wear it in a hospital setting). The pandemic situation improved and many regulations were relaxed. We should thank God for blessing out attempts of fighting this pandemic which has claimed many people, world-wide. pandemic.

The financial constraints in which we are working have not changed. The department is still reporting that we are going to overspend, come the end of the financial year. This problem is creating many problems which adversely affect the performance of our hospital. There are many posts that cannot be filled because of budgetary constraints. However, something positive happened during the course the year. The circular that prevented the filling of non —clinical posts was rescinded! Institutions were given powers to fill any post, provided they have budget. Consequently, the hospital will be able to fill some posts which have been vacant for a long time before the end of the financial year.

The infrastructure of this hospital is beautiful but a big liability, sometimes. For those that do not know, some buildings of the hospital were built in 1880. We need to do a lot of repairs which, needles to mention, cost a lot of money. There are many infrastructure challenges that we need to attend to but, unfortunately, budget is just not enough. We request staff to bear with us as we embark on this painful slow and long exercise of repairing our infrastructure.0`1````

2022 was not a good year for Town hill hospital. We lost 3 nurses this year. ENA Ngcobo, Staff nurse Msuthu and Professional Nurse Nkosi. The latter died in a tragic accident that claimed other members of her family. The three nurses were our colleagues that departed from this world. The 10th October is recognized as world mental health day, the World Federation for Mental Health (WFMH), theme for 2022 is: making mental health and well-being for all a global priority. Over the last few years, the citizens of Kwazulu Natal have been exposed to tremendous impact of the multiple ordeals. KZN has not just been reeling under the effects of the coronavirus pandemic, but the effect of looting, crime violence as well as displacement due to climate emergencies, all of which have had adverse effects to the wellbeing of our citizens.

At Townhill hospital our vision is to "achieve excellence, holistic, transformed mental health care services for the KZN communities", reaching out to just a portion of the close to 1 billion people around the world living with mental disorder. We integrated programs to incorporate the WFMH theme for this year into our outreach for the month of October 2022.

Talks were conducted by our mental officer discussing the mental impact of mental illness on

individual as well as families, to our support services staff. Providing insight on pathways of how to obtain assistance with psychiatric services. Our psychiatric, registrars, medical officers, medical interns, psychologists and occupational therapists engaged in presentations by out staff on burnout, language in mental health and how to prevent mental load shedding. Northdale hospital, which is one of our biggest referral hospitals hosted us for a visit. During the out-reach nursing staff, psychiatrist, occupational therapist and psychologists handed out pamphlets on different psychiatric disorders aiming to promote knowledge and improve patient and staff insight. This provided the opportunities for many citizens and staff to have their questions on mental health addressed individually. Our child and Adolescent team will be conducting outreach to school in the Greytown area, aiming to reach out to children and educators, providing insight into mental illness.

Our dedicated team of doctors, psychologist,









nurses, occupational therapists, social workers and support staff make every effort to make mental health a well - being a priority for the citizens of our province. Our continuous efforts to teach the lives of the citizens in our community are not limited to the month of October but forms part of an ongoing initiatives.

Above all let us thank our Acting Clinical Head Dr Reyanta Bridgmohun for organizing the entire event and of course assisted by her dedicated
