Ugu Health Facilities were not spared in the destruction as some facilities experienced damages, access to some facilities were hindered as bridges were washed away. However health services were rendered despite challenges.

As part of Phuthuma Week which was planned by the Provincial Office for all the districts in KwaZulu Natal, Ugu Health District embarked on TVET Colleges vaccination drive and Health Care services provision for students.

This campaign was held in May 2022 where heath workers had to go out and find clients for the purpose of bringing them back to care and also to find those who hardly visit health care facilities.

District Office and Umdoni sub-district visited two TVET Colleges, that is Ubuhle Bogu in Umkhunya and As Salaam at Breamer. PHC Manager Ms Nonyameko Tibe made sure that all outreach health services were available for all four days, so as to cover all the students in providing different services that were needed.

Principals for these colleges were very excited to work with the department and they made sure that they mobilized as many students as they come for all the days. More than 500 students were seen during this outreach, most of them were taking Covid-19 vaccination as health awareness education was given in the morning before the provision of services, which assisted students to see the need for taking the vaccine. Family planning was also the key service for these four days and students were happy to engage with health care workers in different topics. They got the opportunity to ask questions on sexual reproductive health. While these activities were taking place, District Management and Programme Managers were visiting the facilities to check the operations and also to closely monitor how things are done making sure that clients are being taken care of.

To overcome water outage challenges in Ugu Health District Facilities, Head Office Fleet Department procured the water tank truck to make the situation better.

The truck is stationed in one of the facilities in Ugu and it is controlled by District Office Fleet. It is servicing all facilities in the district ie Hospitals, Clinics, Forensic and Pathology Services, Emergency and Ambulance Services and the District Office. Those who are experiencing water problems contact the district and the truck goes around to those facilities as it is available every day to assist those who are in need.

All facilities are having water tanks, and this is a great improvement in terms of infection prevention and control. It was very difficult for the facilities to operate without water as they are seeing clients on a daily basis.

It is also a great pleasure to announce that the District Office was able to install water tanks which have been in use since May 2022. Senior Management took this decision with the aim of improving daily operation as it is difficult to keep the employees in an office without water.

Ugu Health District Office Manager, responsible for daily operation of the Office and FPS Mrs Vamsile Sakyiamah said, this was a relief for every one who mostly spend time in the office as the office can now request a truck to fill water tankers whenever there are water issues in the Municipality. Even though the focus is on the facilities which are daily servicing the community but the office also benefits.

"Before the tanks it was very difficult for the management to keep staff members in the office on days where the municipality is experiencing water problems. This was distrupting daily operations of the office as staff would be released early because of hygiene issues" said Sakyiamah.

The majority of adult men were not seeking primary health care services in time which causes the delay in treating them when they are sick.

Ugu Health District and Bhobhoyi Clinic recently had an awareness event which was focusing mainly on men to encourage them to seek primary health care services and to regularly visit the clinics just to do check ups even if they are not sick. This will assist in preventing opportunistic diseases and also to get treatment early.

On this day, the department focused on raising awareness on prostate cancer, mental health issues, diabetes, etc. More than 100 people attended the event they were encouraged to shop different services as they were specifically available for the event. The clinic was also operating on this day and clients were continuing to access their normal services and collect

Even though the event was attended mostly by women, men who were present got the opportunity to learn more about prostate cancer and they were screened for it. Some men do not know about prostate cancer. District Non Communicable Diseases Manager Mrs Nonduduzo Ndlovu is encouraging all clinicians to educate every men visiting the clinic about these diseases as this will assist in early detection.

Partners supporting Ugu Health District were also presented in this event, they worked with the department in providing the services. A special thanks to Promed who provided refreshments for the community who attended the event.













IMPORTANT TIPS FOR MEN

- Eat a healthy diet.
- Stay at a healthy weight.
- Get 7 to 8 hours of sleep.
- Be physically active.
- Don't smoke.
- If you drink alcohol, have no more than two drinks a day
- Have regular checkups at your nearest clinic, even if you feel okay
- Schedule an appointment with your doctor when something doesn't seem right
- Know your family history and share it with a health care provider at your nearest clinic
- Give yourself permission to take a break
- Ask your health care provider at your nearest clinic about cancer screenings

Take charge of your health, gents. The sooner you do it, the better.

Five Common Warning Signs of Prostate Cancer

- Pain and/or a "burning sensation" when urinating or ejaculating.
- Frequent urination, especially during the night time
- Trouble starting urination, or stopping urination once in progress
- Sudden erectile dysfunction
- Blood in either urine or semen
