<b>Preparation for birth:</b>			
1.	Checked room temperature; turned off fans, closed doors and windows		
2.	Ensured privacy		
3.	Washed hands (first of two handwashings)		
4.	Placed dry cloth on mother's abdomen		
5.	Prepared the newborn resuscitation area		
6.	Checked that bag and mask are functional		
7.	Washed hands (second of two handwashings)		
8.	Put on two pairs of clean gloves		
9.	Put forceps, cord clamp/ties in easy-to-use order		
<b>Immediate postpartum/newborn care:</b>			
10.	Called out time of birth: hour, minute, second		
11.	Drying started within 5 seconds of birth? ( >5 s, 5–10 s, >10 s)		
12.	Dried the baby thoroughly (wiped the eyes, face, head, front, back)		
13.	Removed the wet cloth		
14.	Put baby in direct skin-to-skin contact with mother		
15.	Covered baby's body with cloth and the head with a hat		
16.	Checked for breathing or crying		
17.	Repositioned the baby and extended the neck		
18.	Stimulated the baby by rubbing the back		
19.	Suctioned if there were visible or audible secretions		
20.	Checked for breathing or crying		
21.	Called for help		
22.	Removed outer pair of gloves		
23.	Quickly clamped and cut cord		
24.	Moved baby to resuscitation area		
25.	Covered baby quickly during and after transfer		
26.	Positioned the head correctly to open airway		
27.	Applied face mask firmly over baby's chin, mouth, nose		
28.	Gained chest rise within <1 min of birth: minutes , seconds		
29.	Squeezed bag to give 30–50 breaths per minute		
30.	Maintained good chest rise throughout or took steps to improve ventilation		
31.	Once baby's breathing well, stopped mechanical ventilation		
32.	Returned baby to skin-to-skin contact, covered baby		
33.	Checked for a second baby		
34.	Gave oxytocin to mother within 1 minute of delivery		
35.	Delivered placenta		
36.	Counseled mother on feeding cues (drooling, mouth opening, tonguing/licking, rooting, biting hand, crawling, etc.)		
37.	Counseled on continuous skin-to-skin care		
38.	Was the communication effective?		
39.	Was there respectful care of mother and newborn?
