



1. Feedback on knowledge gained and clinical observation:
 - a. Ask the participants whether they have each completed the clinical observation exercise? (They must have completed each clinical observation by the end of the Well baby component)
 - b. Ask the participants about anything new they have learnt?
 - c. How did the practice in your hospital compare with what was taught?
 - d. Average the scores from each participant in order to assess the general compliance of your hospital. (Can be completed once all observations have been submitted).
2. Comments on videos: Ask the participants for their impressions of what they saw in the video/s.
3. Link to KZN tools:
 - a. Discuss the relevant KZN tools
 - i. Neonatal record (Congratulations)
 - ii. Resuscitation trolley checklist
 - iii. Transport incubator checklist
 - iv. HBB firedrill and registers
 - b. Are these tools in regular use in the facility?
4. Questions:
 - a. What quality gaps regarding preparation and routine care at birth in your hospital have you noticed?
 - b. Do you support and encourage the presence of birth companions in your facility?
 - c. Are babies transferred from theatre to post-natal ward skin to skin?
 - d. What are your concerns and possible solutions? Identify one simple thing you can change that would improve the care in your facility.
5. Take home messages: Ask participants what are their take home messages? Share the following if they have not been raised:
 - a. What happens to a mother & her newborn during pregnancy, labour & childbirth and in the first hours after birth has a major influence on the newborns survival & future health, well-being & development.
 - b. Health workers have an important role to play.
 - c. Effective preparation for the birth is essential in ensuring optimal outcomes.
 - d. The presence of a birth companion is highly recommended.
 - e. Always remember the mother and the baby form one unit (the mother–baby dyad) and should not be separated if at all possible.
 - f. Skin to skin care should be commenced immediately after birth and continue during transfer, in post natal ward and at home.
6. Complete a roll play of Preparation for birth and routine care of baby at birth. Participants should use the ENC1 Firedrill 1 to assess the role play.
7. Complete the knowledge check
8. Ask each participant to exchange their answers with another and mark the knowledge checks together. Then gather the knowledge checks and capture each participants score on the course register.
